The memory and work of Count Folke Bernadotte, U.N. Mediator
in Palestine who was slain in Jerusalem a year ago, is now perma-
nently honored at United Nations headquarters by a bronze tablet.
Here U.N. Secretary-General Trygve Lie, in a simple ceremony,
unveils the tablet. Behind him are Dr. Ralph Bunche, who carried
on Count Bernadotte's work in bringing peace to the Holy Land;
Sir Alexander Cadogan, permanent representative of the United
Kingdom to U.N.; and Sven Graffstrom, permanent representative of
Sweden, Count Bernadotte's native land, to the United Nations.

ley—Augsburg, Emmanuel (na-
tive) and Mackenzie, gathered in
sumptuous banquet in Lobelo
Church Hall. It was the first oc-
casion that the three congrega-
tions had come together in the
21-year old hall.

Norman Saugstad was master
of ceremonies and the principal
speakers were Chief Outlas,
whose address was in the Chin-
ook language; Rev. R. H. Mc-
Coll of the mission boat Thom-
as Crosby; Isalah Gurth and
Rev. L. G. Sieber with Timothy
Starr as vocal entertainer and
Mr. Davies of Bella Coola giv-
ing a brief piano recital.

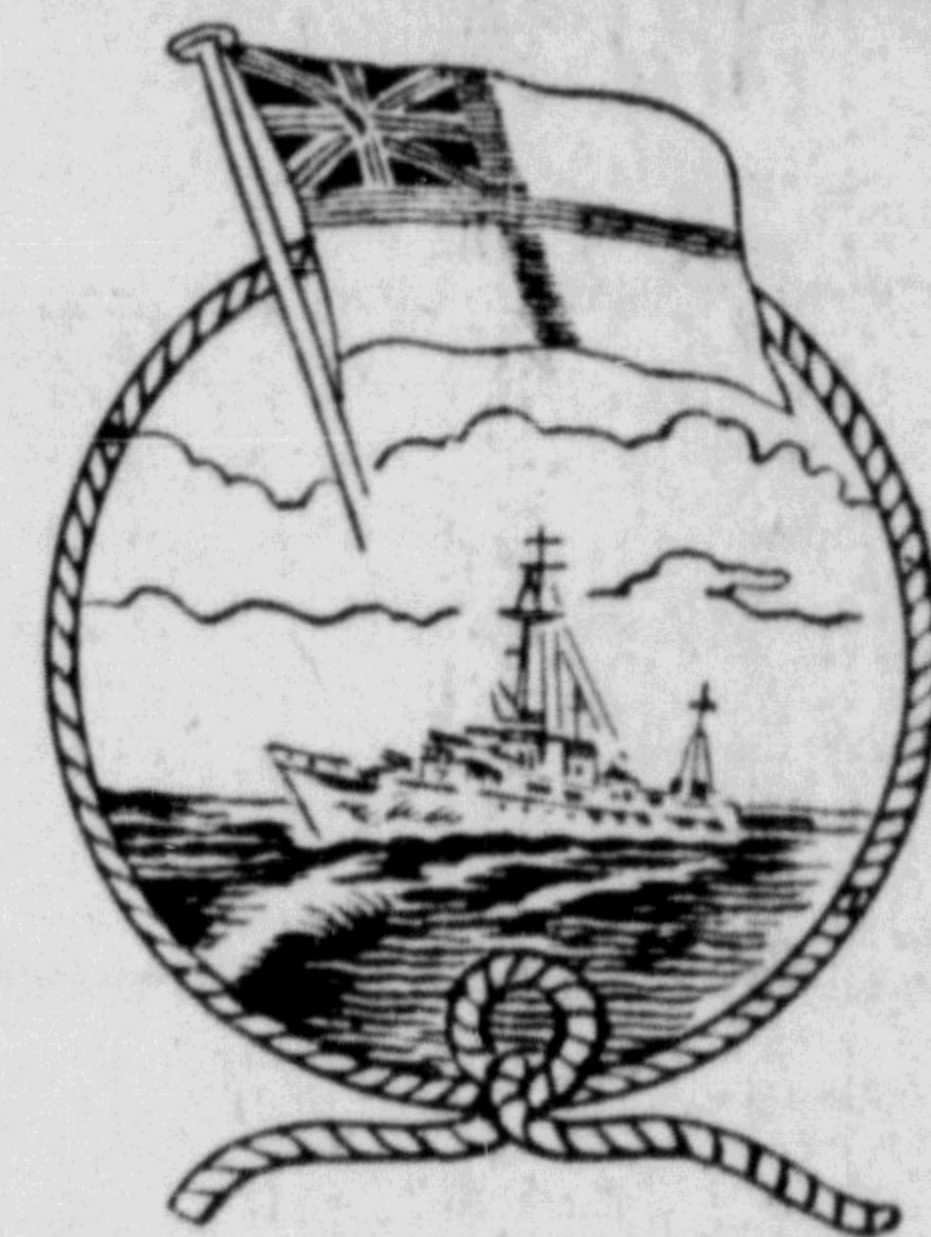
Mr. Saugstad was Master of
Ceremonies and in his remarks
said it was the first such gath-
ering of all church folk in the
hall in 21 years. There were
about 200 people at the banquet.
Those who were called upon to
speak were Chief Poutlas, who
spoke to the gathering in Chin-
ook; Rev. H. S. Forbes, chairman
of presbytery; Rev. R. H. McColl

Missionary skipper of the Thom-
as Crosby IV; Mr. Isalah Gurth
of Bella Coola Valley; Rev. Law-
rence G. Seiber of Prince Rup-
ert. Mr. Timothy Starr of Kita-
maat sang delightfully, and Mrs.
Davies of Bella Coola gave a
brief recital.

During the evening fine words
of appreciation were spoken to
Rev. L. Schuetze, newly induct-
ed into the Bella Coola Charge
and minister of the United
Church to all the churches in
the valley.

The native church folk of
Emmanuel Church entertained
the Presbytery at a banquet in
their Hall Saturday evening.
Folk from all over the valley
were in attendance and enjoyed
many speeches and the singing
of Mr. Timothy Starr. Chief
Poutlas spoke in Chinook tell-
ing the story of his own Chris-
tian faith and urging all to ac-
cept the Bible as their guide
through life, and Jesus Christ
as Saviour. During the evening
the native folk presented a very
generous purse to Rev. A. J.
awton, treasurer of Presbytery,
to assist in financing the meet-
ing.

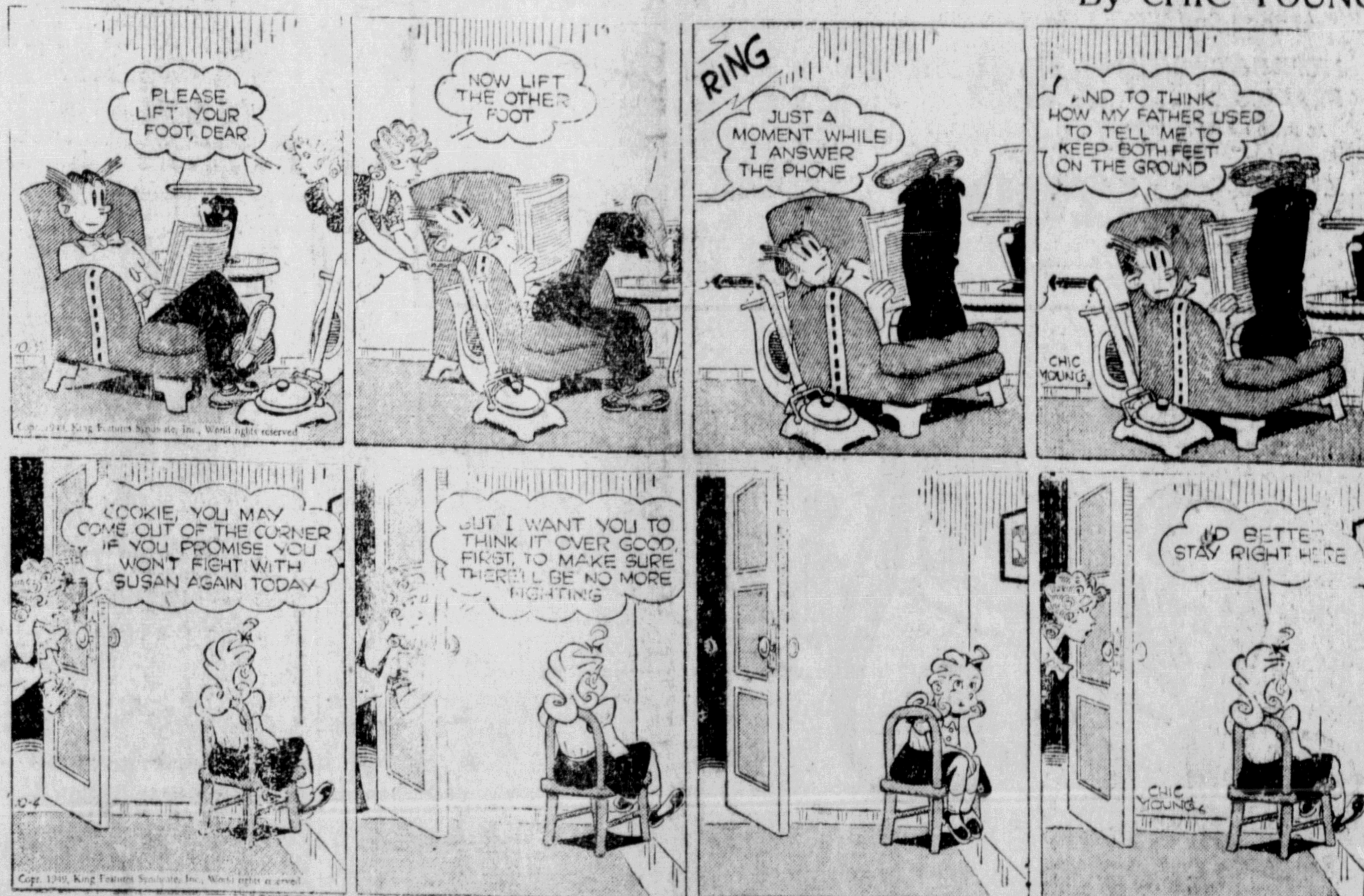
