Activity Everywhere at Civic Centre These Days

Activity! Activity! Activity! Any time one drops around the Civic Centre these days, that is what he sees.

Take yesterday afternoon, for instance. Upstairs we find Miss Jean Travis with her lineoleum block class. Nine women are eagerly learning the art of cutting patterns on lineoleum blocks to be used for printing. But it was potatoes yesterday—just to get the idea across. Today the ladies start on the lineoleum itself. The first step is to put the design in reverse on the lineoleum. From there on it is a matter of cutting away the surface from the parts that are not to be printed.

Last week Miss Travis taught the art of stencilling. Here a stencil is cut of the design. A positive stencil leaves the design cut out so that when it is placed on the material to be painted the stencil covers those parts that are to be left unpainted. With a negative stencil, the design is covered and the painting is done away from the stencil leaving the pattern the same color as the material.

The women are enthusiastic about the work and have found it fascinating. They hope to continue the classes every Thursday afternoon through the winter and teach those who were not enrolled in the present classes.

Downstairs, meanwhile, Rowland Miles is teaching Beverly Boulter, Marilyn Berry and Louise Anderson elementary weaving. The girls are making squares that can be used singly as pot holders or combined with others to make an afghan. The girls are absorbed in the work and trying eagerly to finish their frames quickly and accurately. It's a bit of an extra treat for them, as their class is scheduled for Friday afternoon. "But," Rolly warns them, "don't come around here if you haven't anything to do. We'll soon find something to keep you busy."

Farther down the hall we find Miss Gloria Sather explaining to a group of boys the fine art of the spring board. With infinite grace she demonstrates each exercise and then has the boys do it themselves. The exercises yesterday afternoon were elementary, getting the boys used to being catapulted from the board. There were straight jumps, jumps with arms and legs spread apart, jack-knives, touching the toes with feet spread apart and all kinds of tricky jumps. Everyone was having fun, including Gloria.


