



General Spry became chief About 70 people turned out to commissioner of the Canadian General Council of Boy Scouts Association on September 5, 1946, upon the retirement of Dr John A. Stiles, O.B.E. In order to do so, General Spry resigned as vice Chief of the General Staff of the Canadian Army. He holds the distinction of having been the youngest major-general in the British forces in world war II at the age of 31.

Born in Winnipeg, Manitoba on February 4, 1913, he has been a wolf cub, boy scout rover scout, rover sea scout, assistant scoutmaster and cubmaster

As a junior officer, General Spry served in the Princess Louise Fusiliers (reserve army) in Halifax and with the Royal Canadian Regiment (permanent force) in various stations in Canhis Army career, General Spry made a name for himself in sports circles as coach, organizer and player in football, basketball and other games.

In 939 he was promoted captain and appointed adjutant of his

regiment as it sailed for overseas. After considerable regimental experience, he attended the Staff College. Cemberley and then held various staff appointments. He served as personal assistant to Gen. McNaughton and accompanied him to North Africa and

During the Sicilian campaign General Spry was appointed to command The Royal Canadian Regiment and later was promoted to the rank of Brigadier and commanded the 1st Canadian Infantry Brigade and, later, the 12th Canadian Infantry Brigado

In August 1944, he was appointed General Officer Commanding 3rd Canadian Infantry Division (The "Water Rats") He led this famous Division up the French coast, the Scheldt Estuary, the Nijmegan Salient, and the clearance of the Reichwald and Hochwald forests in Germany. In 1945 he was appointed to command all the Canadian ---atriation units in Great Bri-

eneral Sprv was appointed a member of the International Committee at the Twelfth Bienrial Scout Conference which he attended in Elvesaeter, Norway. in August 1949. General Spry is also a member of the Interna-
