

Net Deficit of \$2,405 In General Revenue Operations

Prince Rupert had a deficit \$2.405 in its general revenue operations last year but showed a minute profit on its loan rate, according to the 1947 auditor's report adopted by City Council last night.

The report was accepted without comment by the aldermen after its approval had been recommended by Aiderman T. B. Black, finance committe chair-

Total general rate expenditures—used in the normal opeation of the city-were \$347,-199, while gross revenues in the general rate were \$344,794, leaving a deficit of \$2,405.

School revenues totalled \$80,-090, while expenditures took an equal amount from the city cof-

Revenue from the loan rate was \$92,808, while expenditure: were \$92,801, leaving a credit of

General rate revenues were made up of \$84,593 in tax levies plus \$1,825 in tax penalties and \$727 interest on arrears. Utilities grossed \$147,389, of which the telephone department grossed \$71,296 and the water de partment \$76,092. The city received \$24,283 in provincial government grants.

Total operating expenditures for the year were \$520,098.


