

Award Of Conciliation Board "Wholly Unacceptable to Union

VANCOUVER (P-The International Woodworkers of America (C.C.L.) policy committee voted unanimuosly last night to reject the award of the conciliation board in an attempt to avert a srtike in British Columbia's coastal lumber industry.

J. Stewart, Alsbury, chairman of the I.W.A. negotiating committee, said in a statement the award of a nine cent hourly wage increase and a maintenance of membership clause in the 1950-51 master contract was "wholly unacceptable" to the union. The union, representing more than 30,000 coast loggers, had asked representatives of 132 logging operators for a 17 cent hourly wage increase plus a
