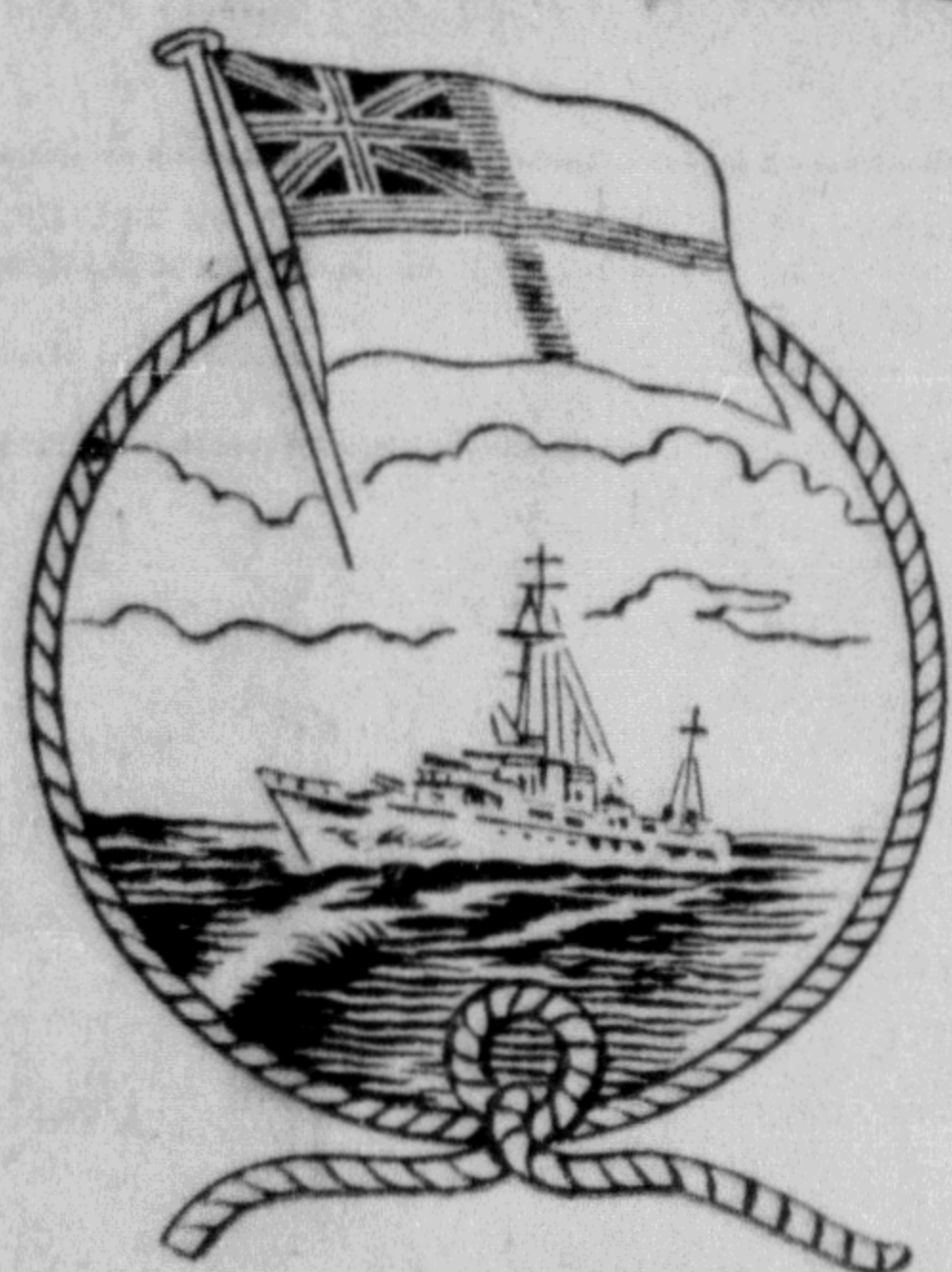

green cedar boughs.

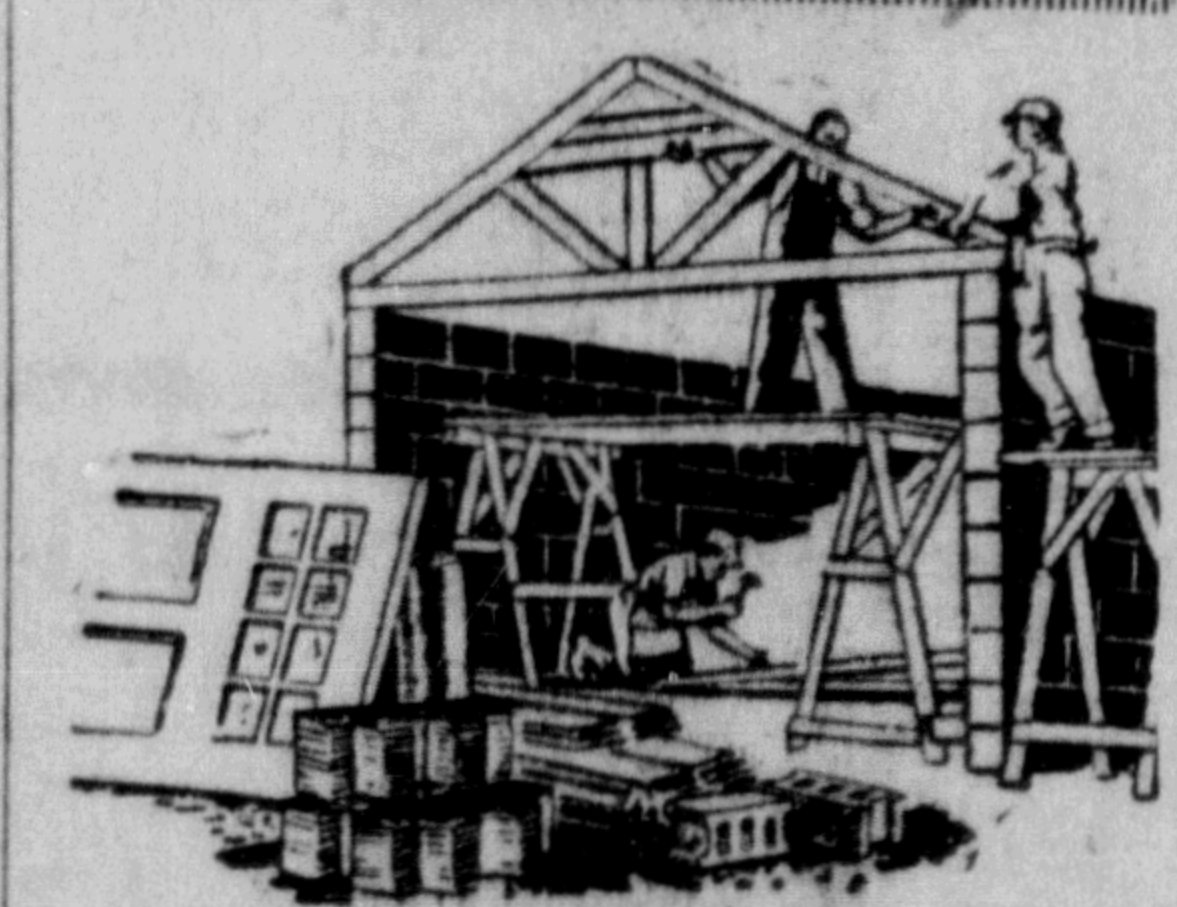
The guests were received by

Austin Webster, guard, play-

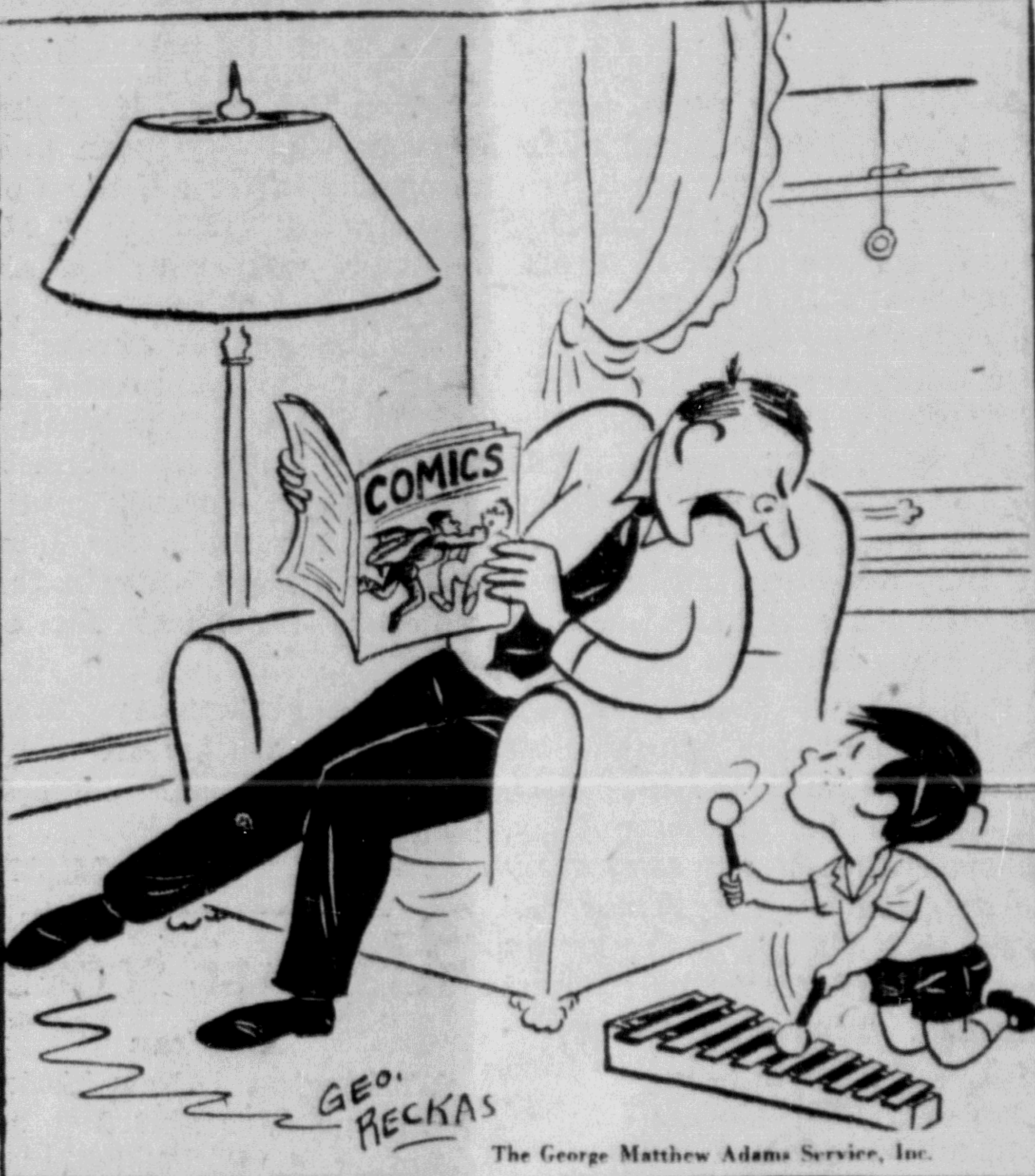
ed with famed Victoria Domi-

Registration on the Dominion or Municipal voters' lists does not mean  
your name is on the provincial voters' lists. To vote in a provincial election  
your name must be on this provincial voters' list.

Be a good citizen! Be sure you are registered. Be sure you vote.

If you are not registered you cannot vote.

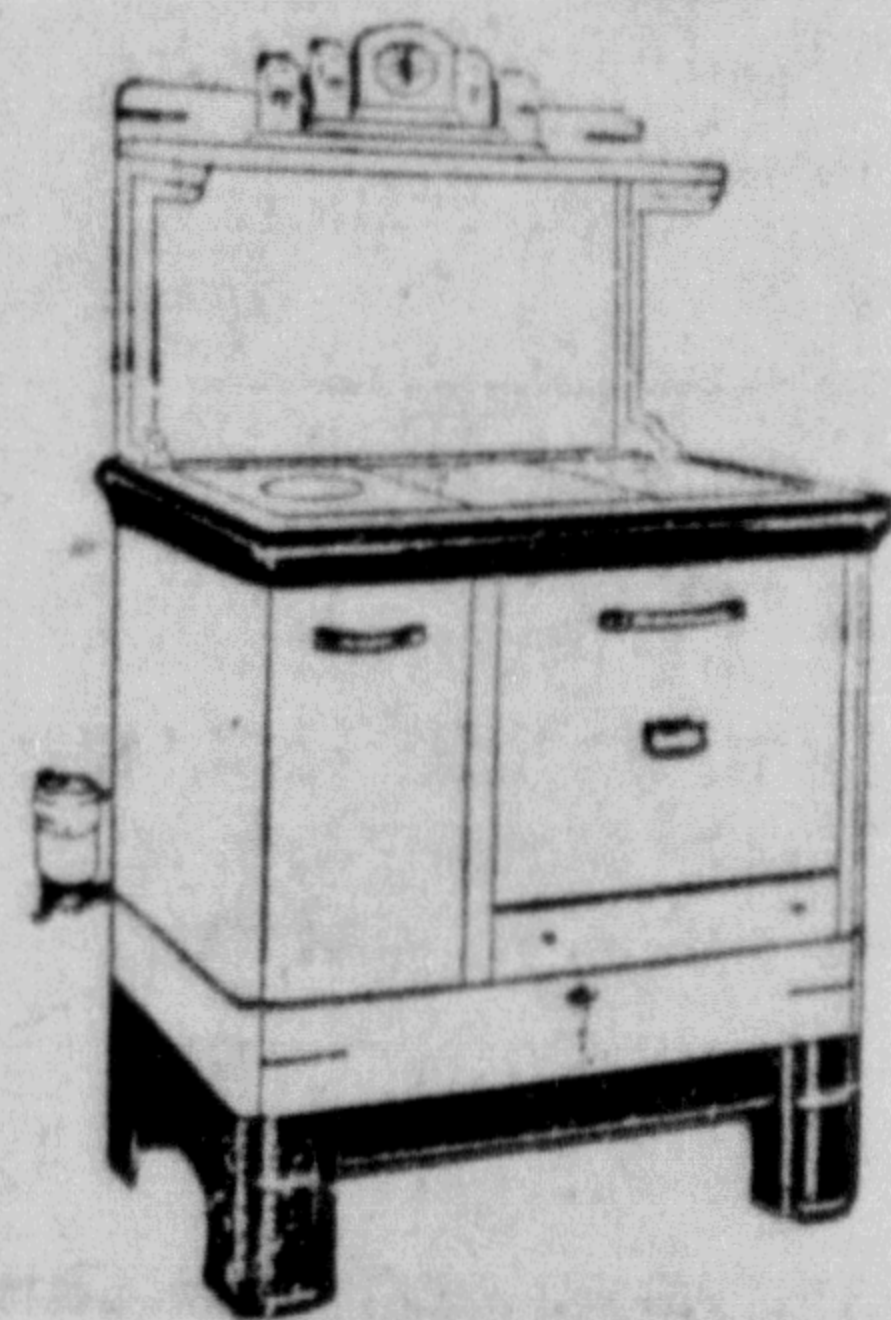
