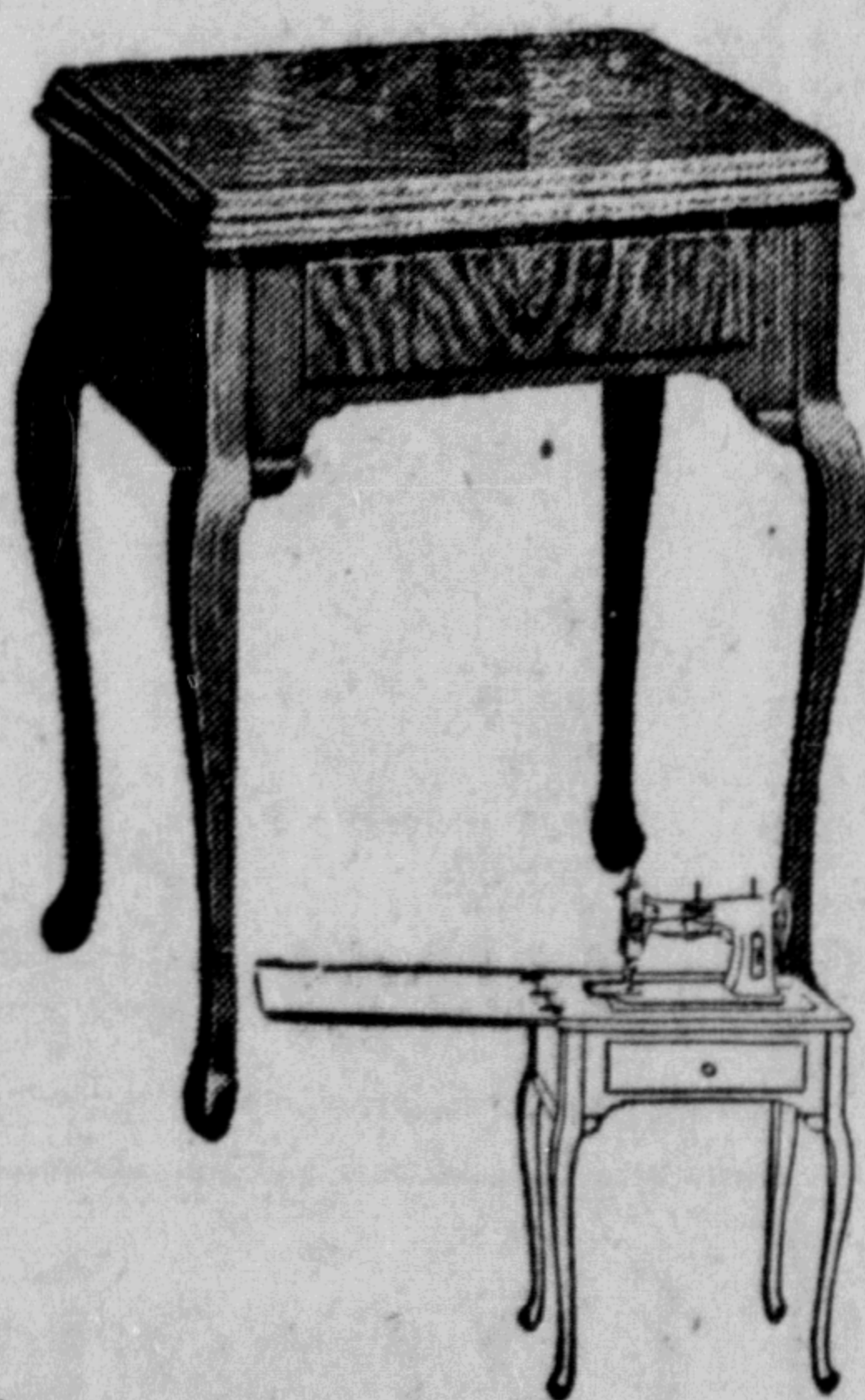

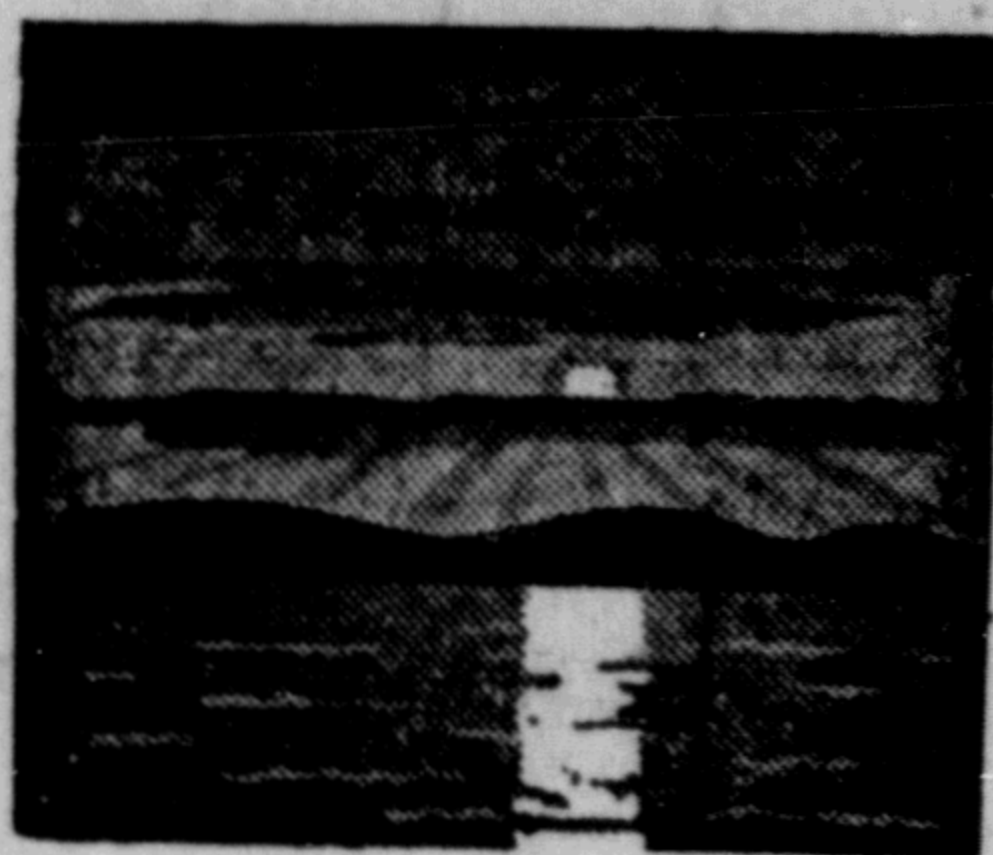

**Dry Dock Busy—CRC Having Extensive Overhaul—Strike Effects Still Felt**

A filip of fall activity is developing at the Prince Rupert dry dock where 102 men are now on the payroll. Packers, halibutters and other vessels are receiving attention and the lighthouse tender Alberni went on the pontoons yesterday for cleaning and painting. She will be coming off next Monday.

Principal job of work being carried out at the present time is an extensive overhaul of John Currie & Sons' towboat CRC after twenty-two years of faithful service. The job on CRC includes extensive replanking, re-decking and new bulwarks. The vessel has been in the yard for the past month and will be there for another two weeks.

Except for passenger boats, the waterfront is a pretty deserted place these days. A few small craft are moving around but the steady stream of fishing boats and others that have been coming in and out since halibut season opened in May are either away in the south or being put away for the winter. No freighters have been in port since the middle of the week and none

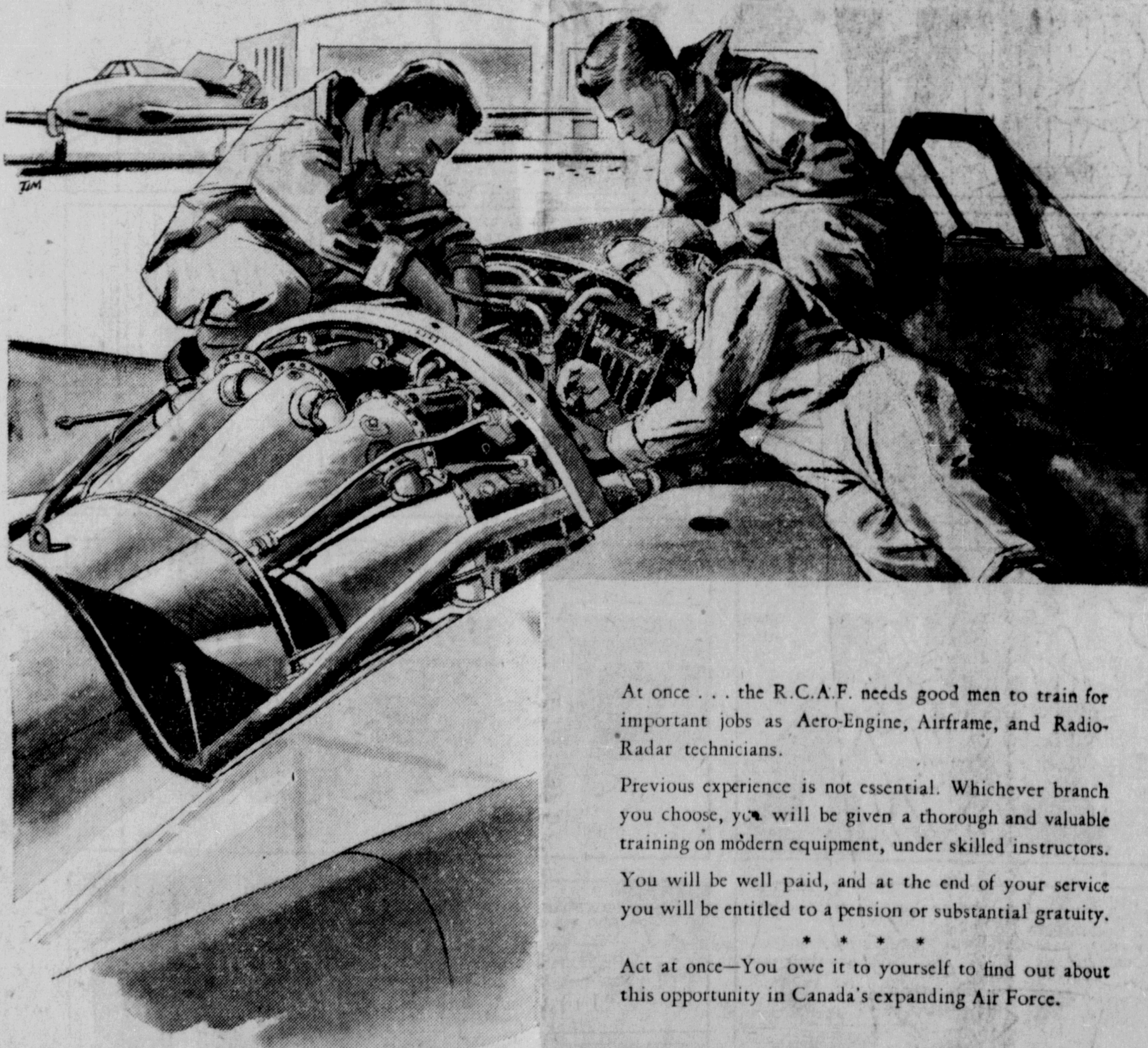
