## Today in Sports

### "Inefficiency" Cry Vancouver Scribes of Hoop Association

VANCOUVER (CP)—Sour notes, charging the Canadian Amateur Basketball Association with inefficiency, have emanated from sports writers accompanying Vancouver Clover Leafs on their across-Canada tour.

The charges arose after Clover Leafs, defending Dominion basketball champs, overcame Alberta and Saskatchewan titlists, Reg Moir (Vancouver Province) says in both Magrath, Alberta, and Regina there was a lack of understanding about commitments made by each province toward the proper functioning of the playoff series. As a result, Clover Leafs now are "in the hole" financially.

"It would seem time for the Canadian Amateur Basketball Association to clean house," Moir says.

"In every other sport the national bodies exercise a tight rein over important playoffs. The C.A.B.A. leaves this to the teams concerned." Moir contends that apparently concerned only with the Dominion finals in Montreal and the Olympic trials in Toronto, the C.A.B.A. has treated the western series like poor relations.

"No responsible officer of the C.A.B.A. was present at either Magrath or Regina. As a result, financial misunderstandings will incur at both places for weeks to come."

"To put it bluntly, the guarantees that the Vancouver team felt were proper, were not met until they reached Winnipeg." The Vancouver team found that after defeating Winnipeg Paulins in the western final, the poor schedule arrangement of the C.A.B.A. cost them an extra \$200 to reach Montreal in time for the Dominion finals.

Last October the Winnipeg basketball people advised Dominion President Laurie Irwin of Toronto that they would not be able to start the western final until April 27. Despite this, the entire schedule of the western, Dominion and Olympic finals were built around the presumption that the western playoff would start in Winnipeg April 26.

Under the circumstances, the Clover Leafs had to fly to Fort William in order to catch up with train schedules. Moir says the extra expense of the air trip should not be shouldered by the defending champions. "All this uproar about finances is indicative of the low calibre of administration in Canadian Amateur Basketball Association today."

### Para-Rescue Unit Stationed In U.S.

MIDDLETON, N. S. — A para-rescue unit headed by LAC J. C. Courtyer of Edmonton, N. B., is the latest addition to the R.C.A.F.'s search squadron at nearby Greenwood Airport.

The highly trained parachutists will descend from aircraft to aid injured or sick persons in remote areas where it is impossible to land a plane.

They will keep in radio contact with their plane, which will drop any necessary supplies, provided by the safety equipment section, under the supervision of Flt. Sgt. W. Goff of Vancouver.

### MONEY HELPS BATTLE POLIO

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa — Hero in the battle against poliomyelitis is the blue vervet monkey. This monkey similar to the type found around Durban, is used by scientists of the South African Institute for Medical Research in Johannesburg, to see whether a person is infected with polio, and will be used in attempts to find a safe vaccine.

"The vervet is one of the animals which contract polio easily, and is suitable for vaccination," said one of the scientists.

"As the monkey does not die from the disease, it can be infected easily by taking polio virus with its food, be inoculated in its abdomen with a solution of the virus."
