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PRINCE RUPERT YEARS AGO

(February 19, 1923)

Thomas A. Bradshaw, light-keeper at Triple Island, died on January 31 and his body remained on the island for three weeks, finally being taken to Prince Rupert by the lighthouse tender Newington. His widow and two daughters were on the island at the time.

Canadian National Railway shops which were destroyed by fire were to be replaced, according to C. J. Quantie, master mechanic for the B. C. district.

The schooner El Abeto cleared Buckley Bay, Massett Inlet with a cargo of timbers for Los Angeles. The cargo was the first to come out of the mill camp there.

(February 19, 1913)

The Prince Rupert Rifle Association held its annual meeting, electing the following officers: captain, R. W. Cameron; secretary, H. H. D. Hemmel; treasurer, C. T. Partington; executive, Judge Young, C. H. Orme, Guy Cameron and J. W. Potter.

Aldermen L. Bullock-Webster and Peter McLaughlin were named license commissioners for the year. Aldermen T. R. Maitland and George P. McCall were police commissioners.

Joseph Dunn and Ronald McDonald, two Lockport miners, were brought to the local hospital on the steamer William Jolliffe suffering from injuries sustained in a blasting accident a couple of days before.

HOW CAN I ??? By ANNE ASHLEY

Q. How can I make a good home remedy for coughs? A. By taking onions and white sugar and boiling together into a syrup. Give one teaspoon as often as seems necessary to relieve the coughing. Q. How can I take proper care of a fur collar? A. The fur collar can be cleaned by dipping a Turkish towel in a good cleaning fluid and wiping over the collar. Brush it about once a week and it will keep free from dirt. Q. How can I make the coffee pour properly, without running down the side of the pot? A. Rub a little butter around the tip of the spout if it is defective in any way.
