SEVEN VESSELS NOW SEARCHING-NO FURTHER TRACE OF THREE UNREPORTED INDIANS

FINDING OF WRECKAGE IS INDICATION OF DISASTER

It became practically certain this afternoon that wreck of a fishing vessel sighted earlier in the week in Wright Sound, seventy miles down the coast from Prince Rupert, was that of the Louisa Todd of Klemtu Cannery and that the vessel had definitely come to grief. Constable Anderson, from the B. C. Police boat P.M.L. 15, reported to headquarters here that a searching vessel, the Good Partner, had picked up a board bearing numbers "KC217" or "KC247." . Klemtu was checked and it was found the number of the Louisa Todd was "KC247." It is supposed that the board was from the Louisa Todd. Aboard the Louisa Todd, overdue from Hartley Bay to Klemtu, were Louis W. Hogan, manager of Klemtu cannery, and three crew members.
