"SLOW" ZONE AT McCLYMONT PARK

The section of McBride Street adjacent to McClymont Park has been declared a playground zone for traffic purposes and a maximum speed limit of 15 miles an hour set. The move was made by city council last night at request of the Civic Centre Association.

Civic Centre Playground Director Rowland H. Miles asked council in a letter to impose a 15 mile-an-hour speed limit in that area for the protection of the children who regularly use the park in the summer months.

Many of the children are of an age at which they do not realize the danger of traffic and consequently, cars travelling at a high rate of speed present a menace, he stated.

Alderman George Rudderham, chairman of the board of works, agreed that a "playground zone" is just as important as a school zone" adding that the move should have been made years ago.

"I wonder if we should have it all year round or just while the park is in use?" Mayor Arnold asked.

Alderman Forman replied that in his opinion, to have a 15 mile-an-hour zone for only part of the year would be confusing to motorists. He favored a permanent playground zone.

Council passed Alderman Rudderham's motion and instructed City Engineer Stewart to have warning signs placed at the roadside.

MINE OPENING OF INTEREST

Announcement of the early re-opening of the Premier mine aroused a good deal of interest in Prince Rupert and Portland Canal where there were still quite a few former employees who had been doing nothing in particular since the closing down of the Premier a year ago. B.C. COAST SALMON PACK

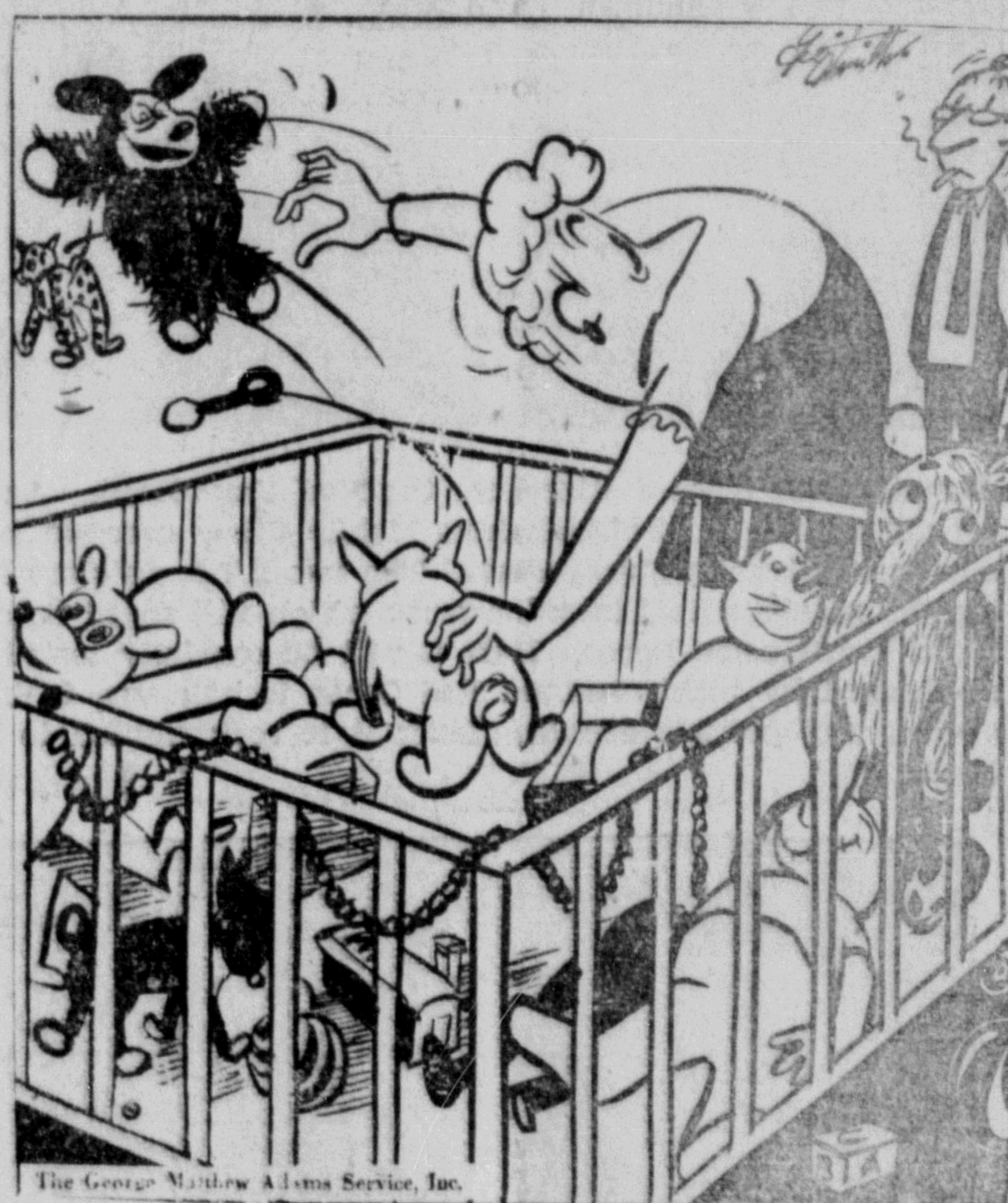
British Columbia coast salmon pack totalled 91,567 cases up to July 16, according to the latest bulletin issued by the Chief Supervisor of Fisheries, Vancouver. The pack was some 73,000 cases short of that for the same period of 1948.

The Skeena and Naas districts accounted for 48,366 cases more than half the total pack for the period, while other areas of District Two added another 17,832 cases to the total pack.

Sockeye pack on the coast was 52,466 cases, of which 28,576 came from the Naas and Skeena areas, Coho pack on the Naas and Skeen was 13,757.

RUPERT-BOUND SHIP AGROUND

Southbound to Prince Rupert with a cargo of fish, the Alaska Steamship Lines freighter Lucidor was reported to be aground in Wrangell Narrows. Extent of her damage is not known. The 7,000-ton vessel went aground during the night.

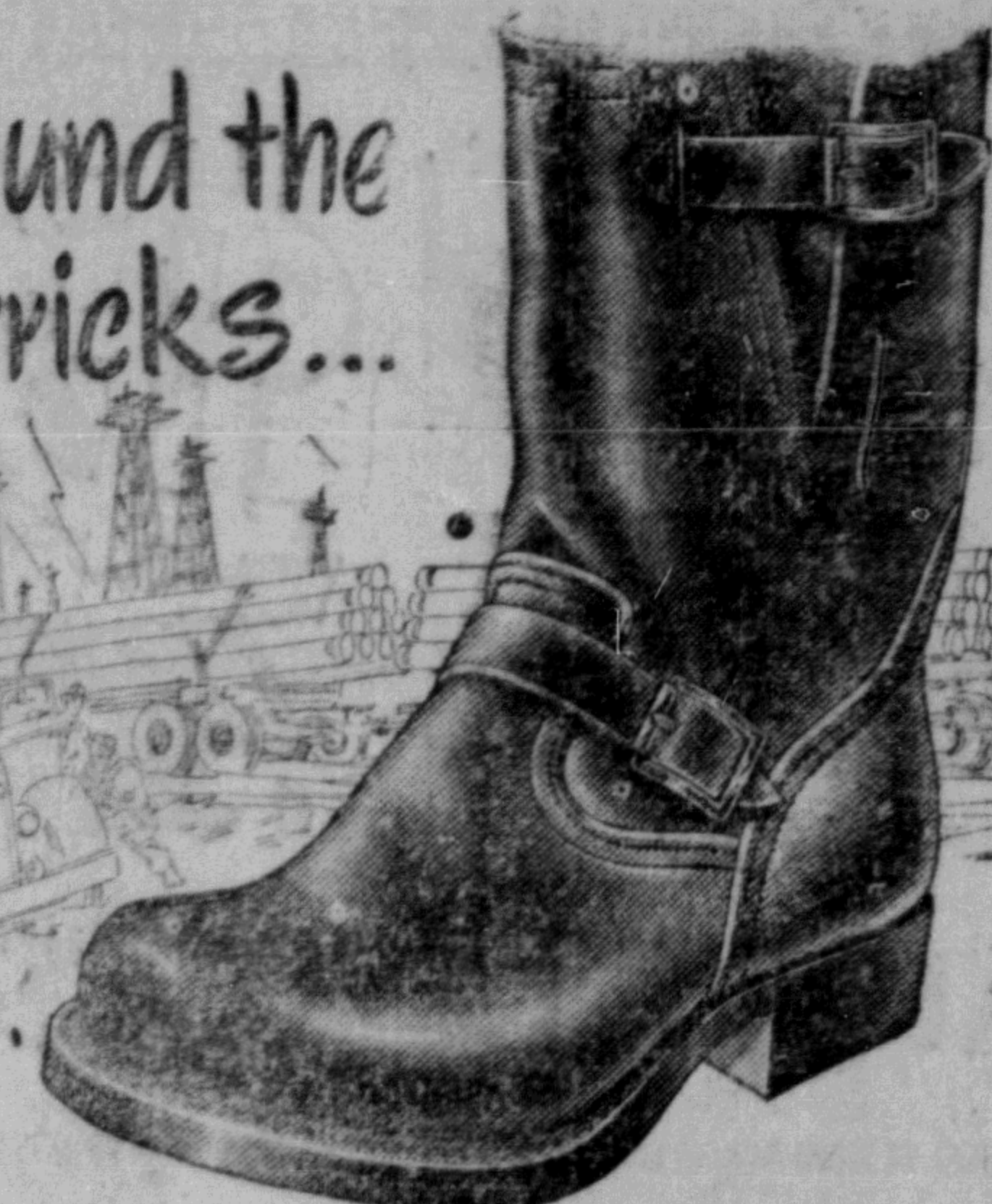

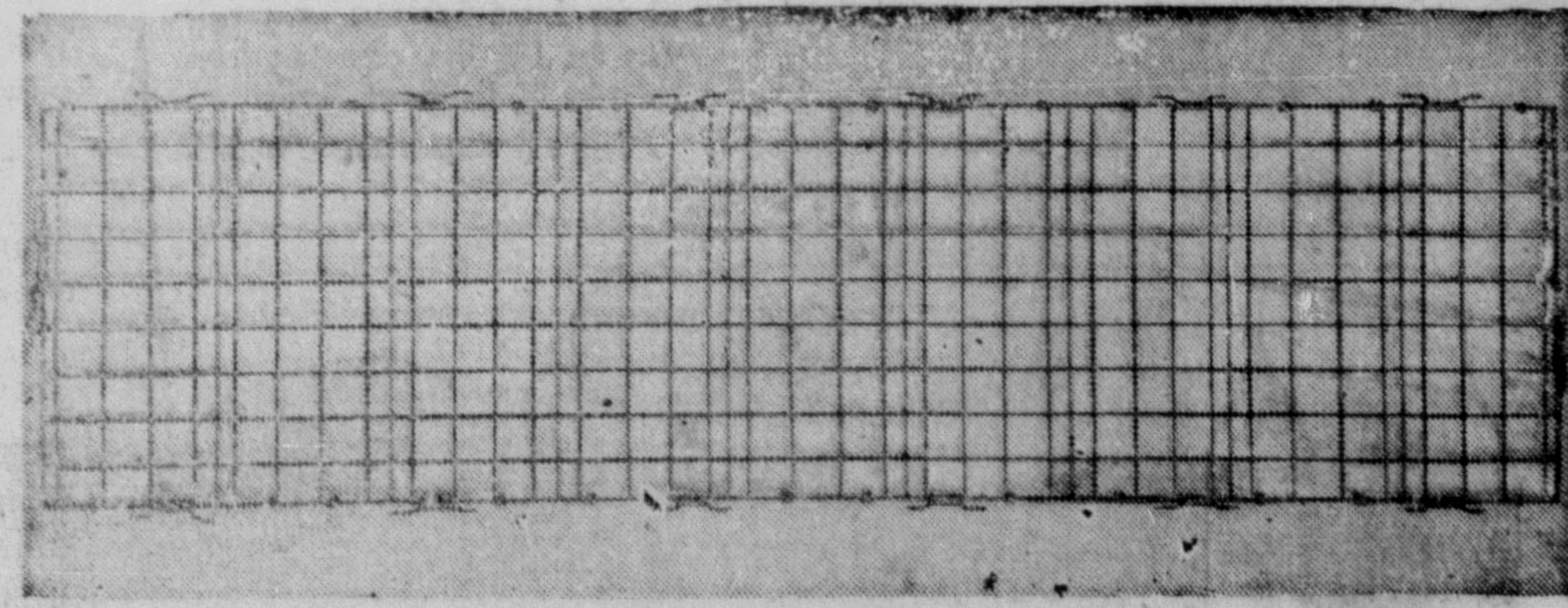
