Believes U.S. Building Could Be City Hall

After a week in the city, W. J. Alder, former City Commissioner, sailed for his home in Victoria. He has property interests here and first came to Prince Rupert in pioneer days.

In reference to the Administration Building on First Avenue, unoccupied since the end of the war, Mr. Alder said he understood that negotiations for purchase, or to utilize it in some way, were pending.

He remarked that the building is not only well put up, but is also fairly new. The location is central, there is ample space, fine views from all directions, plenty of light and air and no commercial blocks or dwellings near.

Discussing the administration building's future, Mr. Alder mentioned the City Hall, suggesting it might be a distinct advantage to make a change to the Administration premises, providing that buying it, and making the place suitable would not involve too great a cost. He doubted if it would.

The change from Fulton St. to First Avenue, he explained

need not be made at one time, but instead could be brought about gradually. So far as the actual city hall services are concerned, he said, the office on second and third floors do not take up so much room. Constructed not long after incorporation, the City Hall, if it cannot be said to have actually outlived usefulness, is nevertheless approaching old age, and is not without considerable inconvenience. One of the chief handicaps, said the former Commissioner, is the double stairway.

To anyone along in years, this is a long and a hard climb, and anyone not having to spend so much effort in reaching the second or third floors, would be greatly relieved.

The city is developing steadily and the day is coming when a new City Hall must be considered but it is unlikely a step like that will be taken without most careful study and calculation as well as large expenditure. It is doubtful if the present premises could satisfactorily serve until the city was prepared to go ahead on a permanent basis.

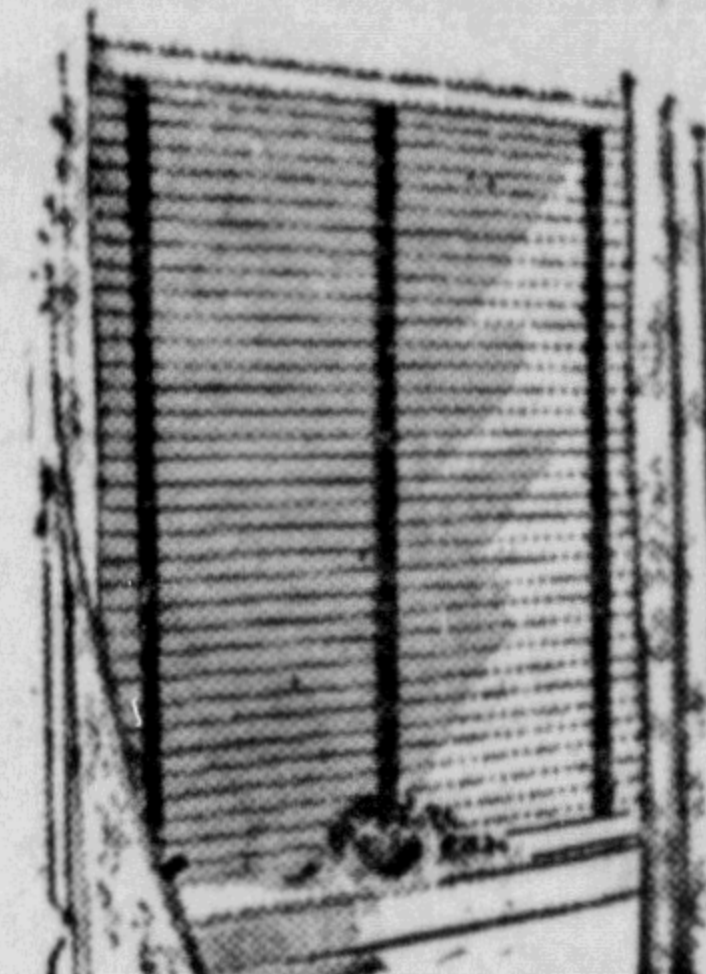
