MAYOR APPEALS FOR CIVIC CENTRE

Mayor Norah Arnold has made a personal appeal to the citizens of Prince Rupert to get behind their Civic Centre Association.

In her talk Mayor Arnold said, "The Civic Centre of Prince Rupert has become an integral part of the life of almost all of us and it is no longer necessary for me to tell you all what this Centre means to us. One fact that stands out prominently in our city records is that we have no juvenile delinquency among the children in our city. I believe that this stems directly from the wise operation of our Civic Centre. And believe me we are the envy of many much larger municipalities in our province and it is up to us to keep this fine institution operating as a going concern."

The Mayor went on to say: "The City Council service clubs and other organizations contribute to the income necessary for the efficient operation of the Civic Centre but the fundamental basis of this operation should be membership subscriptions. I urge this, not only from the financial standpoint, but also from the moral and ethical point of view. It is up to all of us to back up this project, for our own civic good."

"It is hard to realize now what life in Prince Rupert would be without our Civic Centre. It is another home to many of us and every resource in it is used to the utmost. It is such a power for good in our community that we must get behind it. Its usefulness has increased each year, and the prophets of gloom who foretold four years ago that we could never keep it in operation have been confounded. So please take out your membership card and give your support both financially and morally to the best Civic Centre in the province."
