For the Hart trophy which goes to the player most useful to his team, he figures Bill Durnan of Montreal Canadiens as a likeable winner although Turk Broda is now the leading goalie for shut-outs with his eighth Saturday night.

And among the rookies eligible for the Calder award Jack Gelineau gets the nod from "Fergie". Gelineau replaced Frank Brimsek as goalie for the fourth place Boston Bruins. He played for McGill University in an intercollegiate loop last year.

"Durnan is the man who held up Canadiens this season. With less efficient goaling, they wouldn't be in second place today," Fergie writes.
