## Not Impressed With Manager

City Council Wants to  
Know More About It

Until further information is obtained of the city manager plan the city council withholds its opinion it was decided Monday night.

"I don't see where there is anything in the city manager plan that requires a plebiscite of the people. There would be a discussion by the council and they would appoint some official as manager," Ald. George Casey maintained.

"I am not very satisfied with the way we are going. Co-ordination and reorganization would bring better results out of public works expenditure," Ald. Casey added. He felt that he would be opposed to city managership as he believed the responsibility for good management simply evolved from the city engineer's department.

"I am not pressing for city management but am looking for information," said Ald. Casey. "I'm not going to sit here watching everything going to pieces—forsaking our maintenance. If necessary have no new projects but maintain our projects, water works and roads must be maintained even if the mill rate is increased."

In regard to a recent press statement by F. Com. W. J. Alder saying that money could be saved with a city manager, Ald. Douglas Frizzell believed Mr. Alder's statements were misleading. A commissioner and city manager were different responsibilities he pointed out.

"At Mr. Alder's time we had forced insolvency," said Ald. T. B. Black. "Many people by not paying their taxes forced the issue."

Ald. Black said "If the city as a whole had not been allowed to deteriorate the increased mill rate wouldn't be facing us now."

"In 1935 the condition of utilities were beyond conception," said Ald. Frizzell.

**MORE INFORMATION**  
"Wait to see what Victoria has done or some other municipality where the city manager plan has

been in effect with regard to revenue, costs, outline on departments or if cost meet revenues with the plan," Ald. Black advised.

No reply has come from Victoria reported City Clerk H. D. Thain who wrote for information on city manager government. Ald. Casey asked the city clerk to write to Ketchikan and Juneau which he believed have adopted the plan.

"It may be we can save money with this, I don't know... If we can save more by not having so big a council," suggested Ald. Black.

He pointed out that in some American cities where the plan has been in effect, there had previously been such wasteful political machinery that the city management couldn't help but succeed.

In answer to Ald. Donald Fitch's question whether or not the city management was in the British Isles, Mayor Rudderham said he thought they have only the usual mayor-council municipal government.
