ILSE RELEASED, CHARGED AGAIN
LANDSBERG, Germany.—Ilse Koch, hard-faced blonde who was once the mistress of the Buchenwald concentration camp, was Monday turned over to the German authorities to face war crimes charges in German court.
United States Army guards surrounded Landsberg prison to prevent hostile demonstrations by angry Germans as Ilse was released after serving a four-year sentence imposed by an Allied military court.
