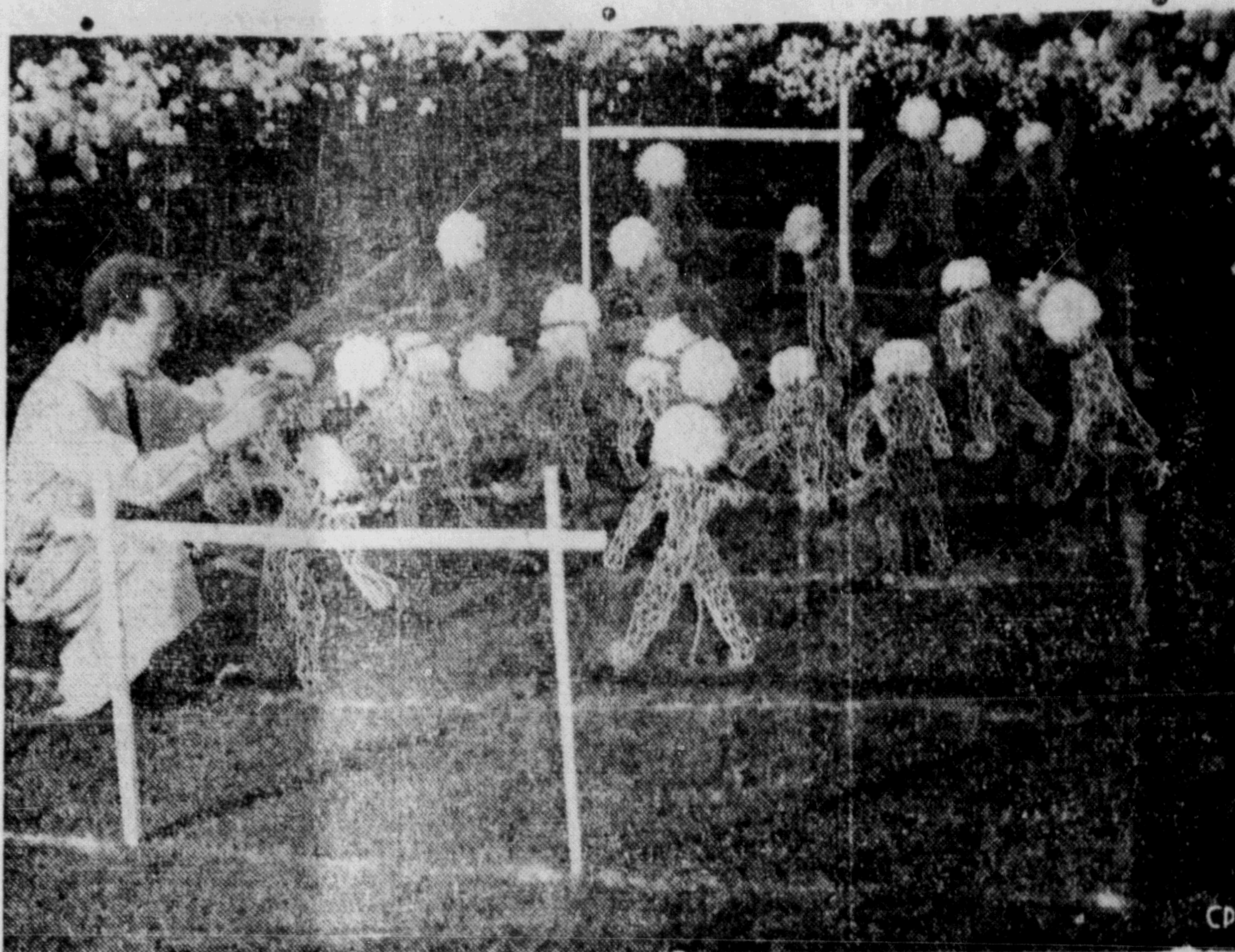

Union steamer Camosun, Capt. Harry McLean, returned to port at 4:30 yesterday afternoon from Massett Inlet calls and sailed at 9 p.m. for Vancouver and waypoints.

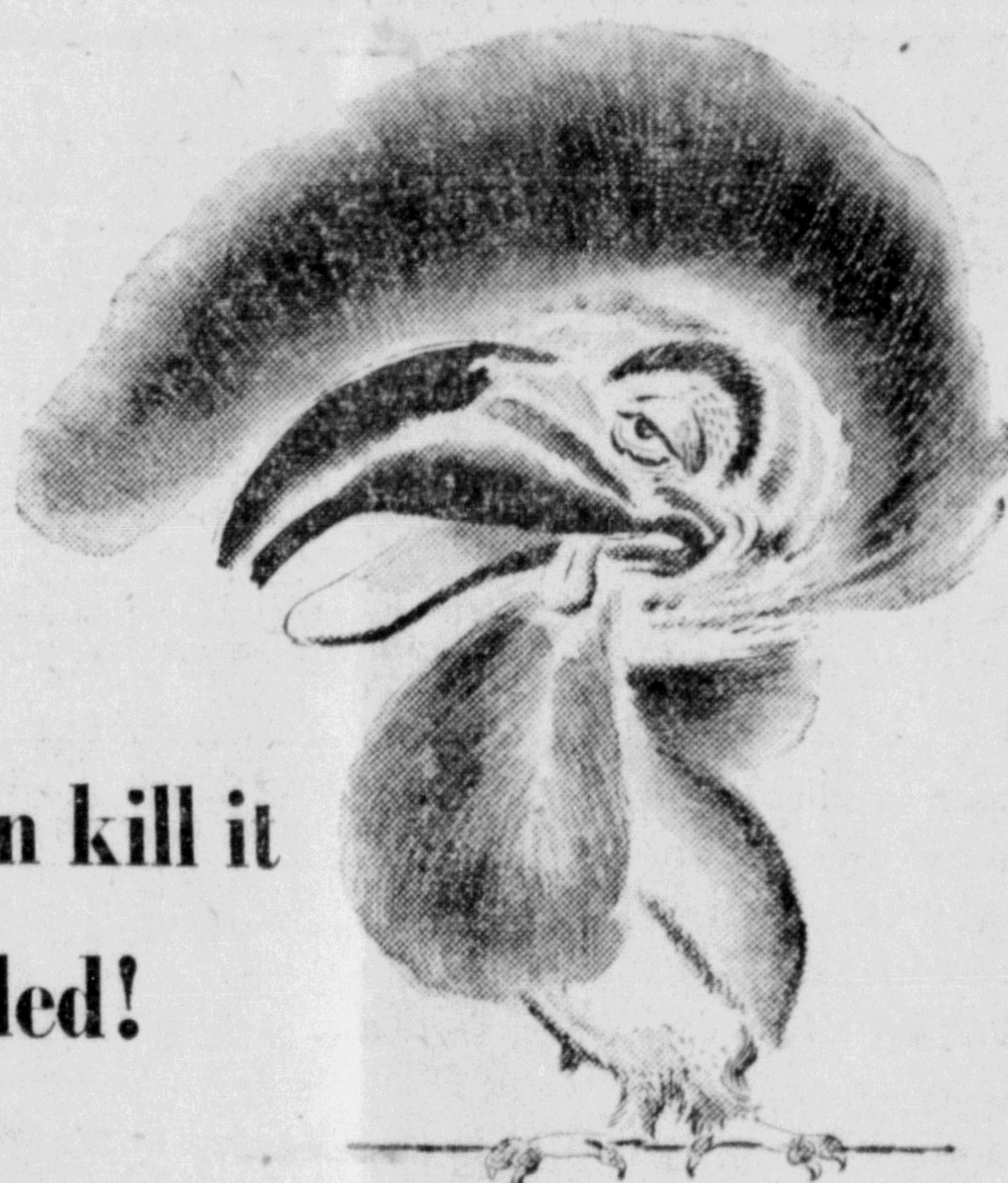
