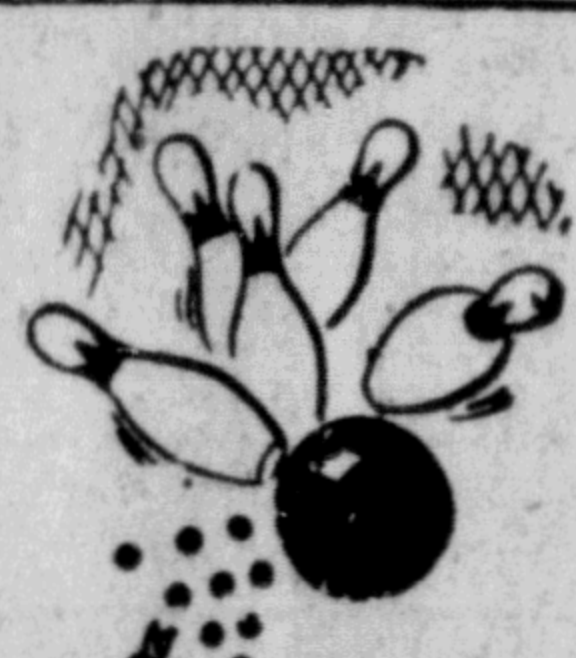

Crosby, Hope Visit Jasper

JASPER — The twenty-first annual Totem Pole Trophy tournament in Jasper National Park, Alberta, which is one of the continent's most spectacular annual golfing events and which was won three years ago by Bing Crosby of screen and radio fame, will be held from September 3 to September 9 with J. A. Rogers of St. Albans, Vt., as tournament chairman, it was announced here by Robert Sommerville, general manager, Canadian National Railways hotel system.

Chairman Rogers, who dug his first golf divot at the Edmonton City Club in 1914, is general manager of the Central Vermont Railway, a C.N. subsidiary. Before coming to St. Albans, Mr. Rogers was one of the best known amateur golfers in western Canada and has played in scores of tournaments in Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia. He is also well known in Ontario, Quebec and New England amateur golfing circles.

The Totem Pole tournament over the championship Jasper Park Lodge course in the heart of the Canadian Rockies, annually attracts hundreds of North America's best known golfing amateurs. For the past three years the contestants have included Bing Crosby and other Hollywood celebrities. Crosby won the coveted Totem Trophy in 1947 and was runner-up to a long-driving Oklahoman in 1949. This year Crosby will be back in Jasper to make another try for the trophy, and he has invited his friendly radio rival, Bob Hope, to take part in the tournament.

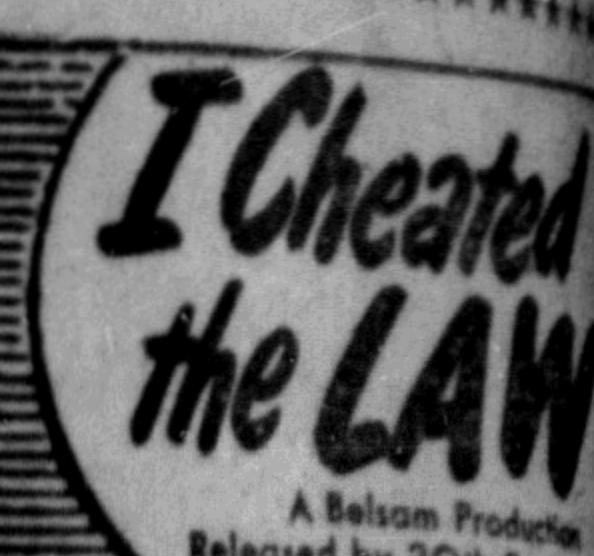

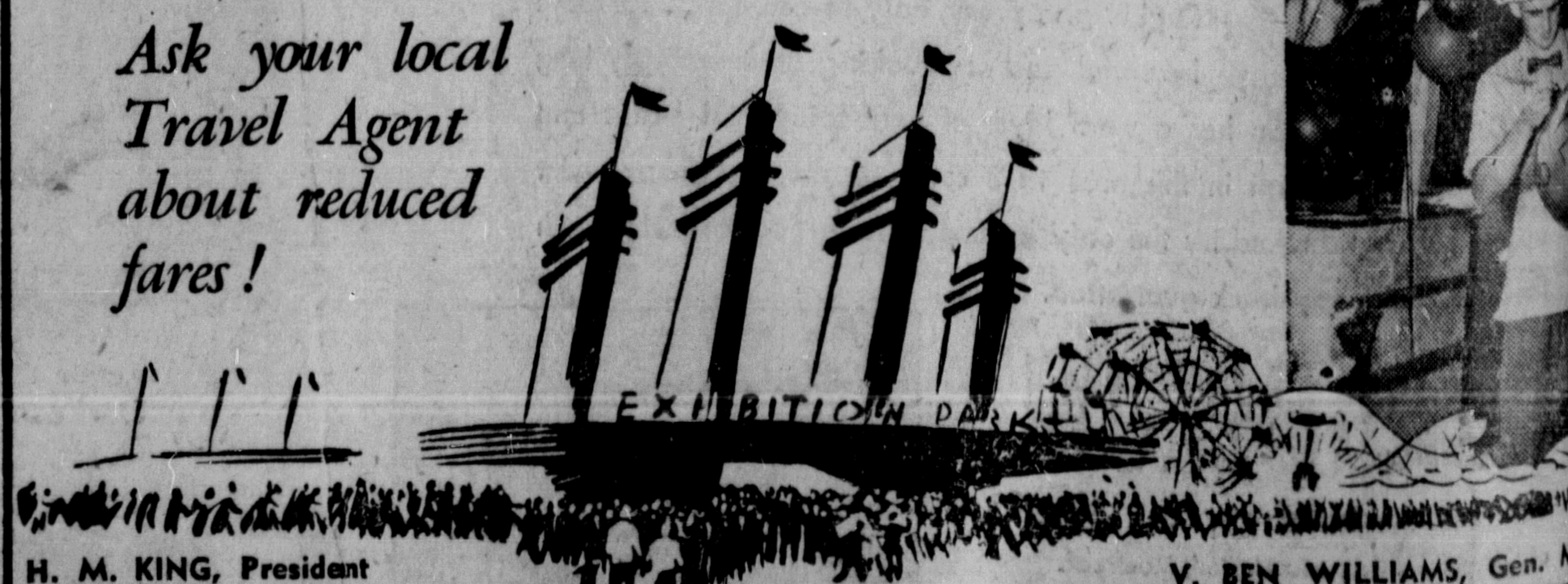
