

Chairman Rogers, who dug his first golf divot at the Edmonton City Club in 1914, is general manager of the Central Vermont Railway, a C.N. subsidiary. Before coming to St. Albans, Mr. Rogers was one of the best known amateur golfers in western Canada and has played in scores of tournaments in Saskatchewan Alberta and British Columbia. He is also well known in Ontario Quebec and New England amateur golfing circles.
