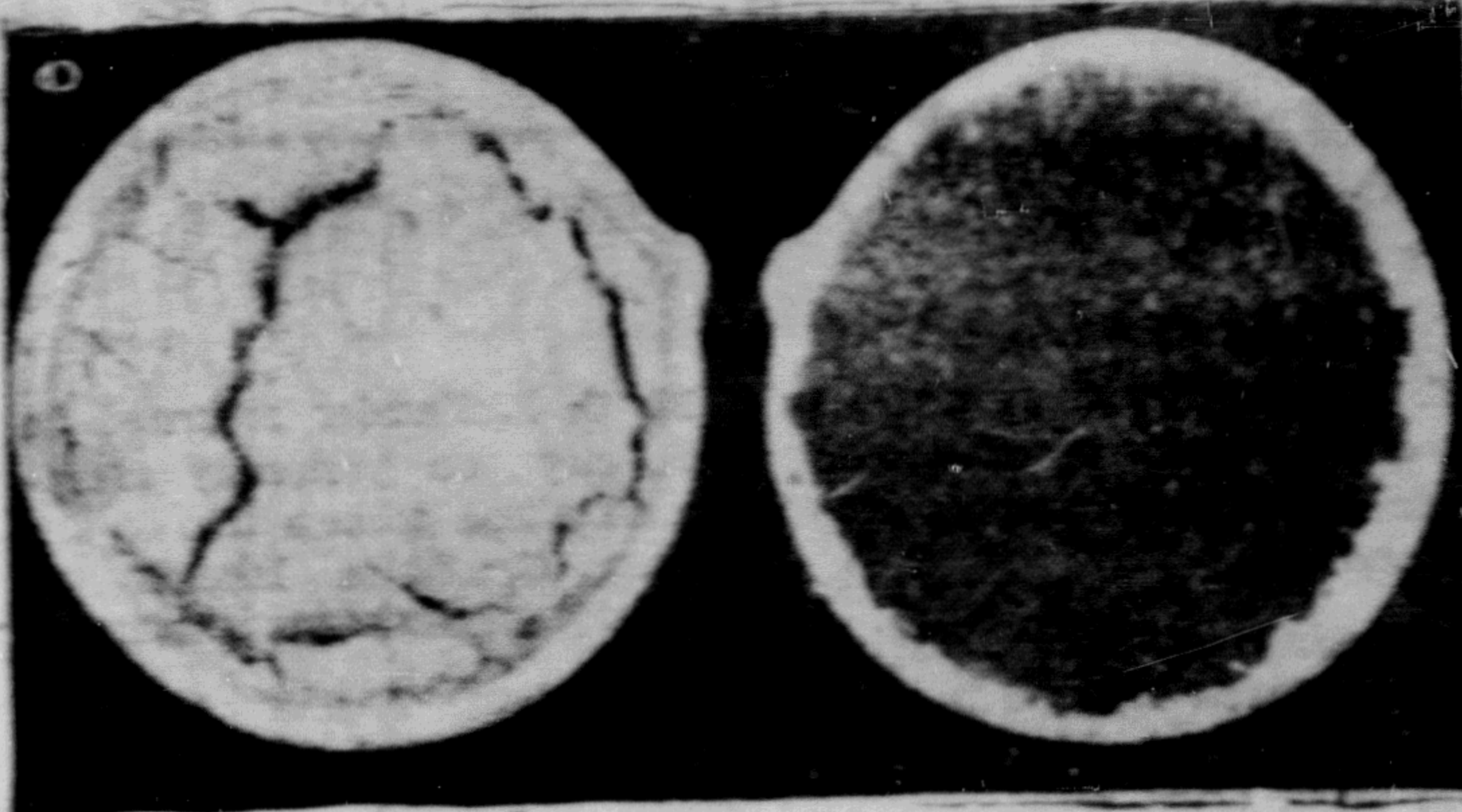
Population Of Terrace 2700

Prince Rupert's school enrolment is 1260 and the population of the city today is estimated at 10,000. Will Robinson of Terrace, who was a visitor in the city towards the end of last week, used this ratio when asked for an estimate of the population at Terrace today. There are 351 pupils enrolled at Terrace schools, according to latest figures. Accordingly the population of Terrace might be estimated at 2700.

The new population of Terrace is a far cry from the bare 1000 there in 1941.

In fact the school population at Terrace increased from 307 last September to the 351 now. A congestion in housing continues in Terrace.
