TERRACE—At a very enthusiastic meeting of the Parent-Teachers' Association the members decided to purchase a film camera for use in the Elementary school.

Mrs. Amdam gave a reading at the beginning of the meeting and Mrs. Campbell brought forward the idea of the "Problem Box," an idea which will be adopted.

Plans for another school concert which will take the form of an operetta to be held in May were made and, as the P.-T.A. will supply all the costumes, Mrs. Bailey was appointed costume convener.

The meeting also decided to pay transportation for the school children who will participate in the Music and Drama Festival to be held in Prince Rupert in May. Mrs. A. Kennedy was appointed chairman of a Liaison committee for approaching the school board on different matters pertaining to the welfare of the children.

## Terrace Man is Burned to Death

James Porter, Elderly Pioneer, Meets With Untimely End

TERRACE—James Porter, 75, long-time resident of the district, died Sunday morning in the Red Cross Hospital from burns which covered his entire body after an explosion caused by using gasoline to start a fire.

Having been hospitalized for a few days deceased had just returned home when the explosion occurred at 2:45 p.m. Saturday. All aflame he was dragged outside by Mrs. E. Gleason, a neighbor, and rolled in the snow but his clothing was still smouldering on his arrival at hospital where Dr. McGilvery at once reported his condition to be very poor.

The house was not damaged as the fire was extinguished before the arrival of the fire engine.
