## What City Council Did

Heard an explanation from the agent of the Sun Directory for Prince Rupert why the city should invest \$100 in the volume, but took no further action on the matter.

Accepted the proposal of L. Robson, chief inspector of electrical energy for the provincial government, that an inspector of electrical energy be stationed here to serve the territory as far south as Ocean Falls and as far east as Smithers and that the city provide office space and a telephone, provided the city be allowed to change its bylaws respecting electricity.

Authorized a survey of property at Seal Cove for purchase from the Canadian National Railways provided it was found the purchase price was nominal. The property is for a roadway.

Approved payment of fees of \$15 for membership in the Central British Columbia Municipal Association and received a letter

notifying of a meeting September 15.

Appointed a committee consisting of the mayor and city clerk to approach the Chamber of Commerce to arrange a dinner for the B.C. Aviation Council September 14.

Accepted the proposal of the Canadian National Railway for a temporary crossing near the Standard Machine Shop while work was proceeding on the sewer, the contractor to assume responsibilities laid out in the proposal.

Passed on to the press a letter of thanks from the Manitoba Flood Relief Fund before filing.

Referred to the board of works and the city engineer a letter from Fred Scadden asking permission to erect signs at the corner of Biggar Place and Third Avenue and on the bluff at the corner of Second Avenue and Eighth Street.

Granted the following trade licences: A. E. Ferguson—U-drive car; A. A. Miller—Dentist; Windsor Studio—Photography.

## SHIPS and WATERFRONT

Southbound after a regular cruise to Skagway and other Alaska points with mostly round trip tourists on board, C.N.R. Prince George, Capt. Ernest Caldwell, arrived in port at 8 o'clock last evening and sailed at 11:15 p.m. for Vancouver. In all the Prince George brought 256 passengers here. Twenty disembarked at Prince Rupert and ten took passage from this port.

B.C. Steamships coast freighter Alaska Prince was in port last evening, having arrived at 9 p.m. from Vancouver with general cargo.

Frank Waterhouse freighter Chilliwack, with veteran coast skipper, Capt. William Gleason in command, is at Watson Island today discharging ten thousand sacks of cement for pulp mill construction. She moved out to Watson Island after having been here since 8 o'clock yesterday morning unloading piles, crooked lumber and general cargo from Vancouver. From Watson Island, Chilliwack will proceed to Alice Arm and Stewart to load where she will take to Vancouver. On her voyage north

from Vancouver to Prince the Chilliwack called at Shesha and Masset on the Charlotte Islands. Capt. Gleason expects to be here about Saturday.

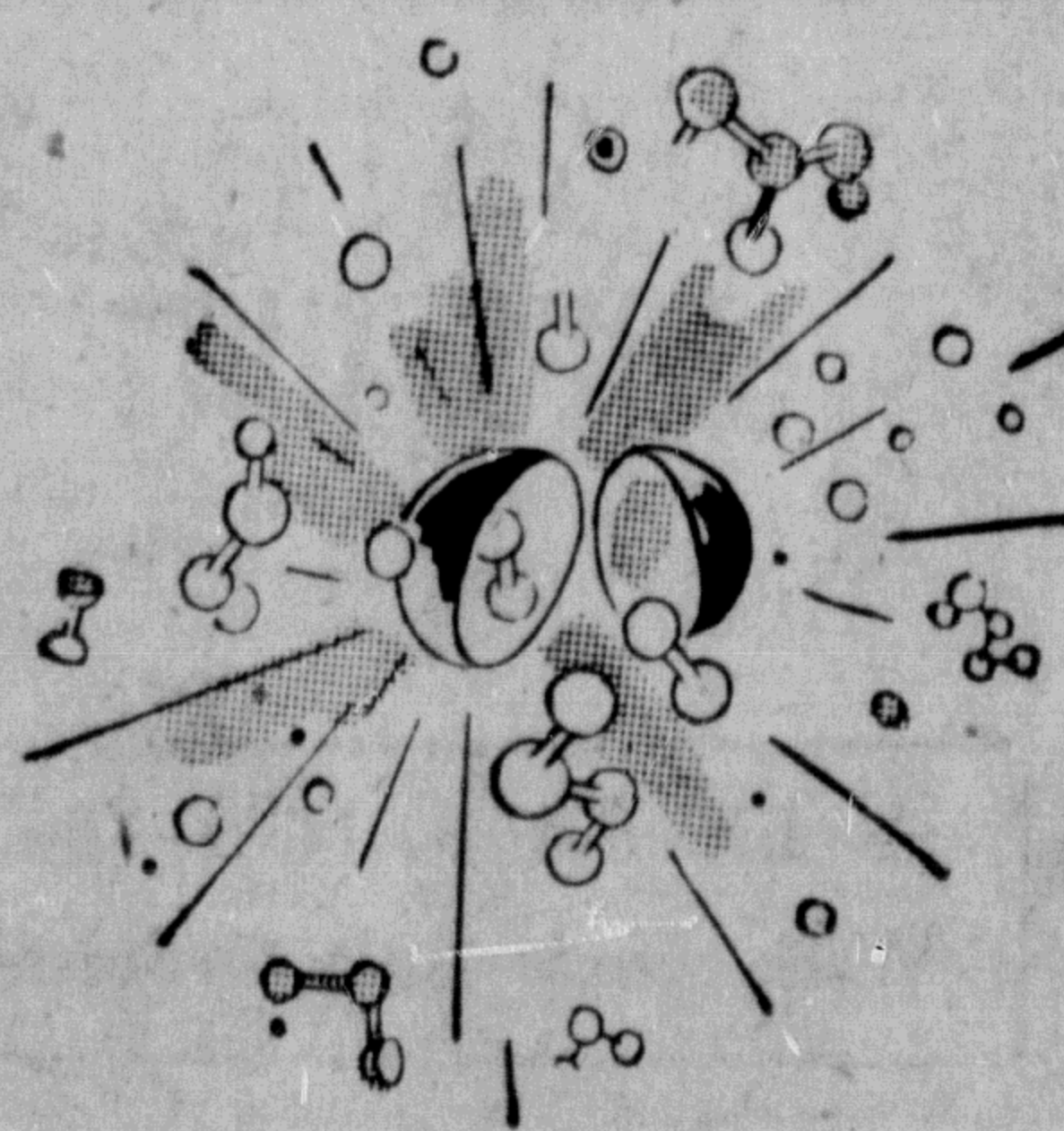
