The Experts Say -

NEW GREEN ONIONS—The new green onions, or scallions, appearing on the market these days are just the thing to give that tired old dinner menu a bit of a lift.

While these new onion may be delicate and young, nevertheless they have real onion character. They usually are eaten as an appetizer or salad ingredient, but are delicious when served in other ways.

Scallions on toast are almost economists describe them as "a real spring treat."

Eight scallions are allowed for inches in length and tie enough for each serving together in a bunch. Cook in boiling salted water for seven minutes. Drain well and place each bunch on a slice of buttered toast, then untie. Pour a rich cheese sauce over the onions and serve at once.

PINEAPPLES—If the housewife is smart she will make good use of those pineapples now appearing in such quantities in the stores.

She might make a Pineapple Salad—cream together one-quarter pound of cream cheese and one tablespoon of salad dressing until smooth. Roll in balls which are placed in the centre of pineapple slices. Serve on lettuce with mayonnaise dressing.
