Baked Rhubarb requires four cups rhubarb cut in one-inch pieces, one cup sugar, one cup warm water, orange or lemon peeling. Clean and cut rhubarb and pour boiling water over it.

Place a little rhubarb in two-quart pan and sprinkle with sugar and the finely choppan in the same manner, then pour the cup of warm water in a slow oven 30 minutes.


