streak of grey. The grey in this area is the coal mining industry; at Telkwa. Mine production is slackening off and men are taking the next boat to an employment agency.  
The shipyard is exceptionally busy, said Mr. Whiting. Between 50 and 60 men are now employed along the waterfront. This is more than usual, the manager said, but not to a great extent. Office workers, the scribe was told, have a large field to work in here. Both male and female white collar workers are in demand. The Columbia Cellulose Company at Watson Island is grabbing a large number of people in this category, and it is said that the banks are literally screaming for help.  
Hospitals need help too—ward maids and kitchen help. Hospital patients can't function on an empty stomach any better than anyone else. The employment office has orders from Miller Bay which cannot be filled. The condition there is worse than at the General Hospital.  
An added blow to the help shortage will strike this summer when the fishing industry develops. "There is every indication of a shortage," Mr. Whiting stated. "But it all depends on the catch," he added.  
The construction industry in and around Prince Rupert has the appearance of developing into large scale operations. The former U.S. warehouse on the waterfront will be demolished, men will be needed to convert the former American administration building on First Avenue into apartments, and if construction on the new hotel is started on Second Avenue and Sixth St., the project will need many skilled and unskilled employees. In addition, other small construction jobs within the city will be available.  
"Our problem here," said Mr. Whiting, "is the winter season." The Department of Labour is anxious to obtain the co-operation of the businessmen and fishermen in this area to organize as much as possible. If these two interests could co-operate to do
