What City Council Did

... adopted a finance committee recommendation that request of the Prince Rupert Dry Dock and Shipyards for reduction in the February water bill due to loss of 641,800 cubic feet of water owing to breaks in two consecutive Sundays be allowed. The breaks occurred on a privately owned property.
... adopted board of works recommendation that: (a) permission be granted to the Dominion Public Works department to reduce the grade on existing roadway to Fairview Bay Fishermen's Floats, (b) a portion of the roadway to the Canadian Fish and Cold Storage Co. be purchased from the Canadian National Railways provided the price is reasonable, (c) an inspector be appointed in connection with the contract covering the new water line installation.
... deferred decision on the attendance of the Fire Chief at the annual Fire Officers pending consideration of estimates.
... granted permits. Builders application for a trade license.
... instructed the zoning committee to study a questionnaire received by the city clerk recently regarding the new dominion-provincial housing scheme. Vancouver has been using the questionnaire which asks for individual housing needs, present accommodation and if a person desires to buy or rent a new dwelling.
... will study Alderman T. B. Black's proposal that citizens with water connections be compelled to bury the lines at a lower depth. Mr. Black stated that, if the lines are not deeper, another cold spell would freeze the connections and in turn freeze the city's main.
... tabled the Museum Board of Northern B. C. request for an annual grant for consideration when yearly estimates are brought down.
... authorized the Mayor and city clerk to sign on behalf of the city, the contract between the city and Mitchell and Currie regarding construction of the Cow Bay sewer outfalls.
... granted request of Wood, Parr and McGay for the use of the city's granite pile near Oland for a fee of ten cents per cubic yard. The rock may be used in construction of breakwaters at the Fishermen's Floats.
