TO MAKE EXPLORATION HISTORY—Passengers aboard the ship Losada when she arrived at London docks, were these two huskies which will take part in the Norwegian-British-Swedish Antarctic expedition to Queen Maud Land, sailing at the end of summer. These dogs and 58 others will stay in quarantine at Brighton for a time and then be placed in the care of veterinary experts to be conditioned for their hazardous venture. Object of the expedition—the first such international expedition in history—is to explore unknown wastes of Queen Maud Land, examine conditions at the Pole and to study weather and geology over a wide area. In charge of the expedition will be professor H. U. Sverdup of Norway.
