trying to get a complete record of her movements as a guide to the industry."

For the service of the fishermen, the Laurier also makes three daily broadcasts, indicating her position, water temperature and the presence or absence of tuna at that time. So far, no tuna have shown up.

Inspector Art Touchings of Port Alberni, who is in charge of the tuna investigation about the Laurier, said that in her extended cruise, water temperatures exceeding 55 degrees were encountered. Last year's experience indicated that tuna are present in water temperatures ranging from a minimum of 57 degrees into the 60's.

"We encountered no 'blue' water nor any appreciable signs of tuna feed," Mr. Touchings said.

Leaving Victoria on June 3, the Laurier cruised to a point 220 miles southwest of Cape Flattery, Washington. Her course led her to a spot 100 miles west of Estavan Point, then north to a place 100 miles south of Cape Cook, then further northward to 40 miles south of Cape St. James, then up the west coast of the Queen Charlottes about 65 miles offshore.

Thursday, the vessel leaves for the open sea again to head westward 120 miles southwest of Langara Island. She will work her way south until she arrives at Victoria, after which she will go in for overhaul.

Her sister ship, the Howay, will continue the patrol later in the summer.
