These lads will be leaving Prince Rupert on July 11 and by special arrangements are to be flown to Vancouver by Canadian Pacific Airlines. They leave Vancouver with the British Columbia contingent of some 350 Scouts on a special train, arriving in Ottawa July 16. The Jamboree is expected to include 3,000 boys, the B. C. contingent being led by Col. Keith Dixon, former District Commissioner for Prince Rupert.

**COUNCIL WOULD INVESTIGATE POWER OUTPUT**

Northern B.C. Power Co. will be asked by the city to provide a record of its balance of electrical power production with consumption during the last year.

The request was approved by city council Monday night on recommendation of the utilities committee in order to substantiate a statement allegedly made by the company to the B.C. Power Commission, that the company is developing enough power to meet current demands and to take care of anticipated needs.

To satisfy themselves, the aldermen supported a recommendation by the committee that the power company furnish the city with graphs illustrating the maximum and minimum weekly development during the last year and also show a record of maximum weekly consumption during that period.
