These are believed to be the final Canadian boats to sell halibut here following the recent closing of the season in Area No. 3.

### Chick Disease Campaign On

OTTAWA — The federal Department of Agriculture yesterday imposed a ban on imports of poultry because of the serious outbreak of Newcastle disease in British Columbia poultry flocks, it was announced today.

"Effective immediately and until further notice no person may import into Canada any poultry, raw poultry carcasses or parts thereof or poultry eggs," said the announcement.

In addition, no person may move any poultry out of a quarantined area of British Columbia without permission of an inspector under the Animal Contagious Diseases Act."

Newcastle disease, raging unchecked through poultry flocks in British Columbia and skyrocketing the loss into potential millions, finds poultry raisers and government officials still seeking a cure for the scourge. With more than 350,000 chickens and turkeys already dead, the provincial Department of Agriculture at Victoria say that loss to the province in potential income is fast nearing the \$3,000,000 mark. Close to fifteen per cent of the province's chicken population has been wiped out with heaviest losses in the Fraser Valley and on Vancouver Island.

Estimates place federal government aid to stricken poultry producers in the province at \$600,000.

Newcastle disease is similar to influenza in humans.

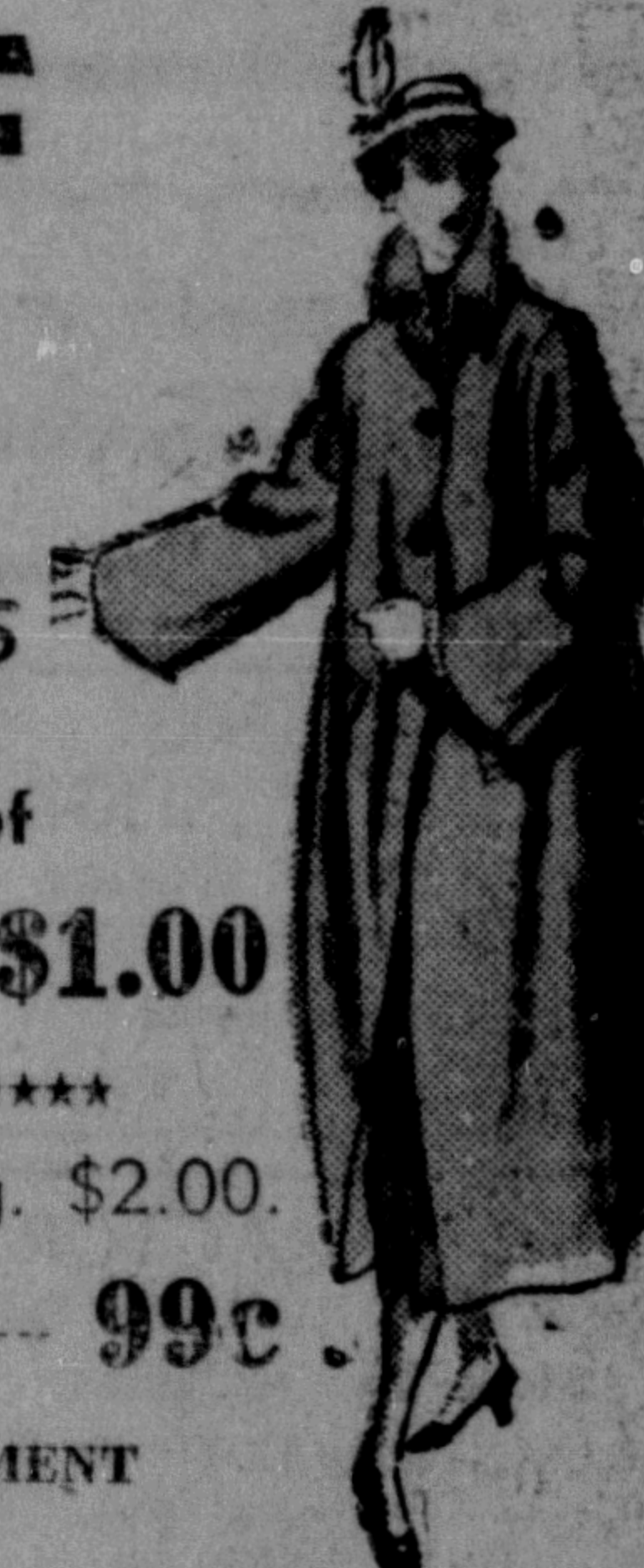

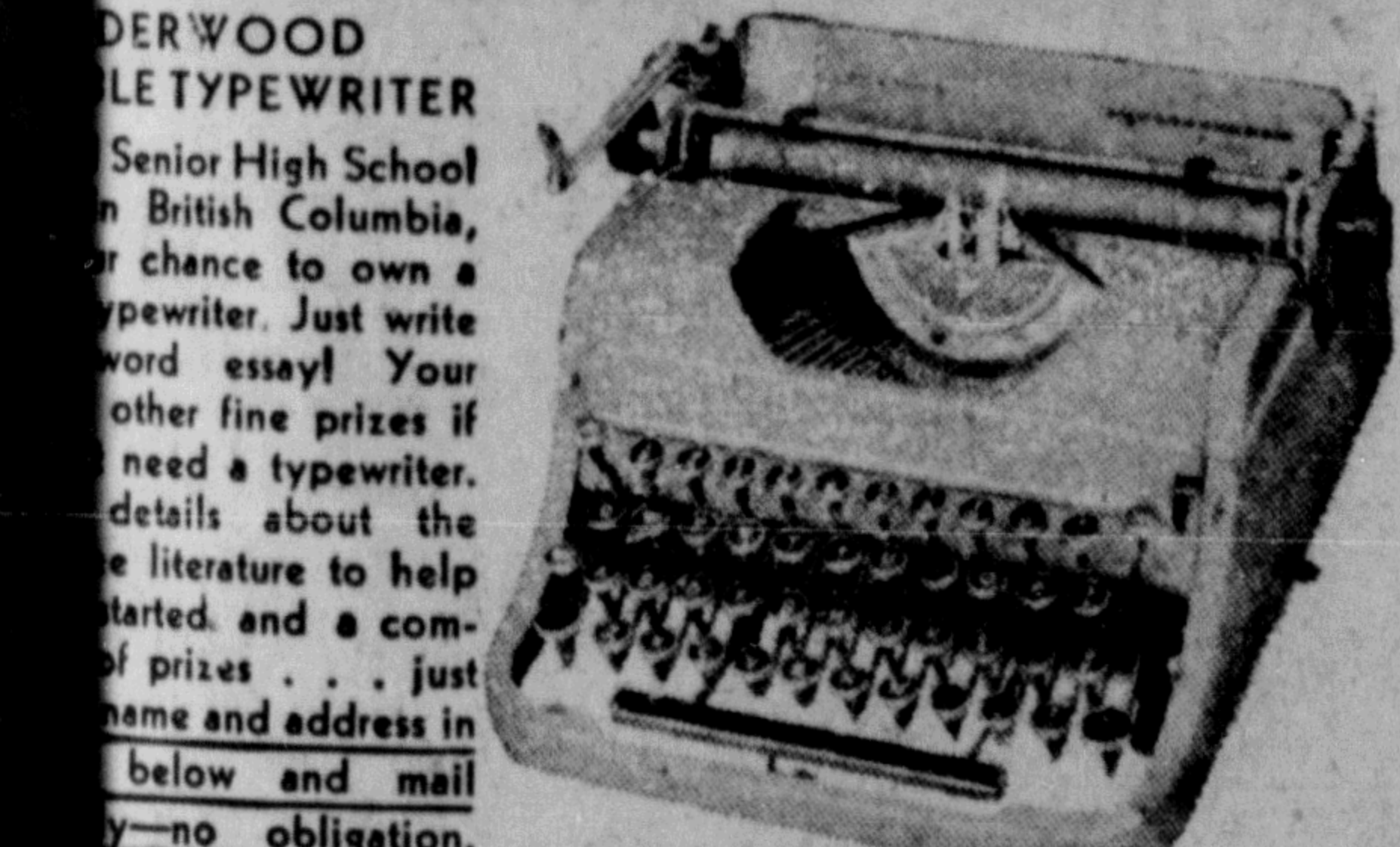
