Doctor Of Divinity

At a convocation of his alma mater—Montreal Presbyterian College—degree of doctor of divinity will be conferred May 2 upon Rev. A. E. Wright who reached the city yesterday from Sherbrooke, Quebec, to assume the pastorate of First Presbyterian Church here. The degree will be received for Mr. Wright in his absence by his friend, Rev. Dr. A. S. Reid.

Born and educated in Paisley, Scotland, Mr. Wright served overseas as a machine gunner with the Canadian Army in World War I after which he was in the mission field of the Presbyterian Church in the Fraser Valley at such points as Murrayville, Mount Lehman, Cogland and Bradner. In 1928 he graduated from Montreal College and was ordained to his first ministry at Kimberley, B. C. the same year. From 1929 to 1935 he served in pioneer and exploratory work in the Peace River district, building and dedicating churches free of debt at Brownvale, Dixonville, Grande Prairie, Wanham, and Riverside. He was first moderator of the Peace River Presbytery.

In 1935 Mr. Wright went to Ontario and had charges in South, Missouri and Mintore. He was called to Wallaceburg in 1937 and remained there until 1944 when he was called to Sherbrooke where he remained until coming here by special arrangement through the church board of missions.

Mr. Wright was married to Miss Annetta Logan of Victoria in 1916 and has a family of four children—sons, Gordon, physicist with the National Research Council at Montreal, and Charles, in third year at Bishop's University, Lennoxville, Quebec, and two daughters, Helen and Marion, who have come here with their parents. They are now in residence at the newly renovated Manse.

A reception for Mr. and Mrs. Wright will be held following evening service this Sunday. Speaking to the Daily News yesterday, Mr. Wright expressed appreciation at the warmth of his reception and the excellent shape in which the Manse had been put to accommodate him
