

C.C.F. Gets Good Campaign Reports

Campaign Manager George Hills told members of the local C.C.F. Club, at a meeting which practically filled the clubrooms, that candidates W. H. Brett and H. G. Archibald were receiving encouraging support all over the provincial and federal ridings. Election matters were the principal subject of discussion after routine club business had been quickly disposed of.

ELECTION IS NOT ORDINARY

Dr. L. M. Greene Defines Issue in Coalition Speech at Terrace

"No ordinary election is facing us this time," declared Dr. L. M. Greene of Prince Rupert in a coalition election campaign address at Terrace.

"The two parties had two very different philosophies of thought. One believed the state is supreme and individuals were regimented to the benefit of that state.

The Coalition believed man was supreme and not to be ordered around. The party believed in personal freedom which was lost in every country that had adopted socialism. Even in England under a very benign Labor Government the people were not free and Dr. Greene told the story of the farmer who contrary to state decrees planted grain which he knew would grow better than that ordered by the government. A few days before the harvest a bulldozer was sent to that farm and the grain crushed into the ground. There was no personal freedom there at all. The C.C.F. was not peddling this aspect of socialism which meant resignation of the individual.

Coalition had given the province the best government B. C. ever had. The speaker named the C.C.F.'ers "Wolves in Sheep's Clothing but nevertheless Wolves."

Speaking of the C.C.F. government in Saskatchewan, Dr. Greene said the government had

advanced in social services but not as much as B.C. Certain industries had been purchased by that government and all Corporations were either not operating or operating at a loss. The speaker listed these industries. \$500,000 was paid for a woollen factory which cost the taxpayers \$147,000 loss. A shoe factory which cost taxpayers \$180,000 to buy and was closed down. After a labor dispute, a box factory was taken over and so far, had cost \$10,789. A tannery cost \$175,000, fish food plant \$750,000 and closed down, brick factory \$28,280. Not one of these industries had made one cent. "We too shall pay for losses if we put the C.C.F. in power in B.C.," declared Dr. Greene.

Not one C.C.F. candidate ever operated any business to the extent of 1% of 1/10 of the ninety two million budget. The coalition party have good, tried and true seasoned men of unquestionable integrity and these must be returned to office. Among the many accomplishments of the past four years were, Better Schools, Power lower in cost, land clearing accomplished, big industry in the establishing of the celanese mill and the probability of an even bigger industry coming. In the future, Northern B. C. projects included replacement of highways, extending of P.G.E. and the Aluminum project. He concluded his address by saying that "we in Northern B. C. should get everyone to vote for the man who has done more to advance this north country than anyone else—E. T. Kenney."

Starting off on a humorous vein with his recollections of the banquet celebrating the opening of the Skeena Highway a few years ago, Dr. Greene expressed his pleasure at being here in the community he had come to know and like. This was the first time he had been associated with Mr. Kenney, a doctor and politician together on the same platform was unusual.

"As far as I can see the people are showing a very general tendency to favor private enterprise and democratic principles rather than state monopoly and control," said Olof Hanson yesterday, following his arrival from Vancouver, in speaking of the federal and provincial election trend. "People still want to have a form of government which will permit of their freedom to think, say and do what they like instead of being regimented by the state which would come under a socialistic government."

At Ocean Falls Tuesday night, Mr. Hanson met with an enthusiastic crowd of Liberal supporters and he states that the feeling there is very much in favor of the party candidate, Ted Applewhite.

Mr. Hanson will be proceeding in a day or so to the interior to take an active part in the Applewhite campaign.
