HIS IS THE SEASON of the year when we-talk in delightfully vague terms of the value of the tourist industry and the desirability of bringing more and more tourists to our community and district. Possibly, we are so engrossed with the interest in the dollars and cents that are to be derived from their presence, either directly or indirectly, that we do not think too much of what we are going to offer them.

The fact of the matter is that it is not difficult to get tourists. By steamer and railroad they have these many years beaten a well-established trail here. The only limit is our capacity to handle them. By highway the tourist volume is increasing steadily year by year.

So, we would say, we do not need to exercise ourselves too strenuously in our efforts to bring tourists here but should be more concerned as to what we are going to do for them when they come, to make it interesting and comfortable for them when they get here, to make sure that they will have so enjoyed themselves that they will want to return and will interest others in coming.

Nature has endowed us with invaluable and unique primary attractions-beautiful scenery comparable with the best in the world, refreshing weather which everyone seems to appreciate more than ourselves, the fish and the game. Those are the natural assets upon which we have to capitalzie. Meantime, we should make sure that, instead of enhancing what we have, we do not detract from it by community untidiness, lack of development and neglect to organize or even provide service.

Things like this do not just take care of themselves. We should do something about providing better and more adequate accommodation, reception and guidance of our visitors, organization to give them a good time, tours to points of interest, making ready to handle hunting and fishing parties. We have been doing a good deal of talking about these things but a lot of it has gotten little further than the talk sage. Nobody has been doing very much about it. Action along these lines, as we see it, is the real job. We ought to be getting our goods ready to sell before we start advertising them too intensively.
