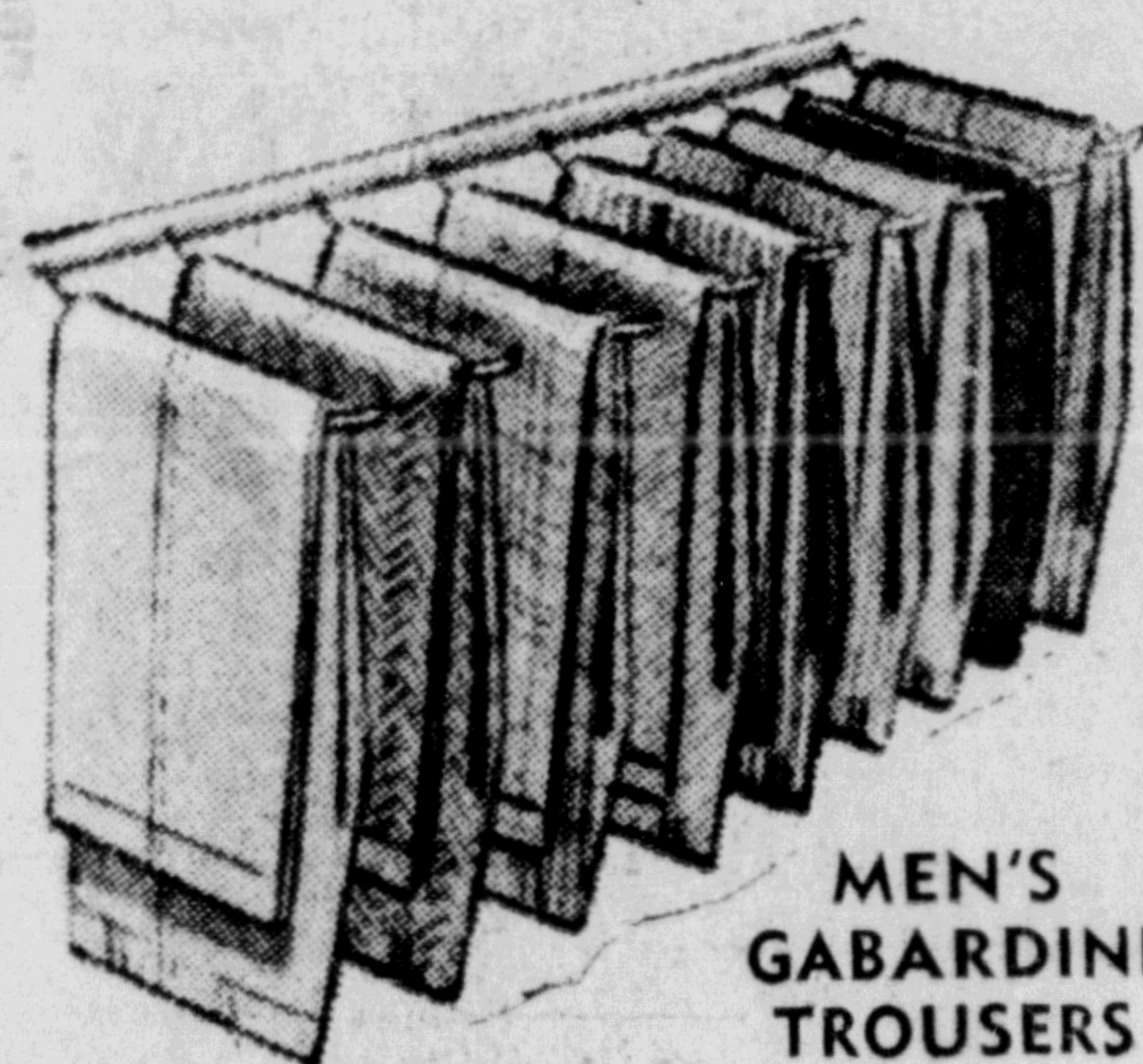

P.T.A. Enjoys Fine Program

Business Also at King Edward
Session Last Night

Vocal solos by Mrs. F. E. Anfield and Leonard Sykes, and Scottish folk dancing conducted by the "Thistle Club" were highlights of an enjoyable meeting of the King Edward School Parent-Teacher Association held in the school music room on Tuesday evening.

The president, Mrs. R. E. Mortimer, was in the chair and, despite the inclement weather, there was a good attendance of some 70 persons.

Considerable business was transacted. Mrs. J. Bowman was elected vice-president of the organization.

The King Edward School P.T.A. unanimously endorsed a resolution of the Prince Rupert Teachers' Association that teachers be given the right to hold municipal office. Principal R. G. Moore spoke to the motion.

Mr. Moore introduced Dr. Duncan Black, Director of the Prince Rupert Health Unit, who in turn introduced Mrs. Black to the members.

C. H. Insulander pointed out the need for another dentist in Prince Rupert so that school children might be accommodated. A motion was passed along this line.

Membership convener Mrs. W. W. Bowes reported a membership of 175 to date.

Mrs. P. Mark gave an interesting account of the founding of the Parent-Teacher Association first in the United States, then in British Columbia and in Canada. The Prince Rupert organization was formed on February 13, 1924, and in 1945 was divided into individual school groups.

Mrs. F. E. Anfield, accompanied by the piano by Mrs. G. D. Mead, sang two delightful numbers: "Lassie o' Mine" and "Spring Song." Mrs. Anfield accompanied Mr. Sykes whose selections, "The Hills of Home" and "The White Dove," were beautifully rendered. Both singers received hearty applause from an enthusiastic audience.

The meeting was then turned over to the "Thistle Club" who, with their president, W. G. Murray, were the special guests of the evening. Scottish folk dancing, old and new, was much enjoyed.

Delicious refreshments with a Scottish flavour were served under the capable direction of Mrs. B. Roald.
