# Victoria Report

**VICTORIA**—It's 100 years since the arrival at Esquimalt of a famous ship—the "Norman Morison," Capt. Wishart. Every new land has its noted immigrant ships. Most famous, of course, was the "Mayflower," sung about in song and story. The British Columbia coast has its "Mayflowers" too, stout little vessels that braved storm after storm on the long voyage around Cape Horn from Britain.

The "Norman Morison" reached Esquimalt, March 24, 1850. She was just a slip of a ship, only 26 feet across and not much more than 100 feet long. Smallpox broke out. One man died. For weeks she lay becalmed, thus further infuriating her passengers who were anxious to get to their new homes.

Perhaps the most noted passenger on that noted voyage was Dr. John Sebastian Helmcken, young black-bearded surgeon coming out to take a position with the Hudson's Bay Company at Fort Victoria.

In his reminiscences he tells of the first time he stepped ashore and the first time he saw James Douglas. He said that Douglas did not impress him. He appeared gruff and unfriendly. Helmcken soon changed his mind for he promptly fell in love with Douglas' eldest daughter and soon there were wedding bells in the Fort and so was established one of Victoria's first families.

The Legislature has approved the Government's gift of a mace to the Legislature of Newfoundland.

Premier Johnson some months ago conceived the idea of such a gift. He thought it would be a gracious gesture from the farthest west to the farthest east capital of Canada.

The mace is now being manufactured in Vancouver. It will be a masterpiece of the craftsman's art, gilt-on-silver, weighing 50 pounds. The Royal Crown and Royal coat-of-arms are on the top. There will be a floral motif of maple and dogwood leaves. Three dolphins will symbolize the fishing industry of B.C. and Newfoundland. There will be the coat-of-arms of Canada, Newfoundland and British Columbia and a rope motif will show that Newfoundlanders and British Columbians make their living by the sea. On the bulb at the bottom of the mace will be the British Columbia Thunderbird.

It is announced that Minister of Finance Ansecomb will take the mace to St. John's in a few months for presentation to the Legislature of Canada's 10th province.


