**Sport Shots**

Sad, but true, is the plight of the Big Four's Montreal Alouettes caught in a three-way tie between early football, late baseball and no public stadium the Alouettes were forced to postpone their schedule week-end football date with Hamilton Wildcats because of the little world series baseball program.

Elmer (Montreal Herald) Ferguson says simply that "Montreal is pretty badly off. So long as the present overlapping of sports events exists, and it seems likely to become chronic, not much can be done about these tangles," he said. "Nothing at all, in fact," Elmer adds pessimistically. "When the two major stadia are privately-owned and dedicated to the sport events of most interest and profit to the owners."

Ferguson recalls that in 1924 when Montreal Canadians were forced to play a world series in hockey on Ottawa ice, the embarrassing situation started a movement which resulted in the erection of the Montreal Forum. "There isn't much chance that the plight in which Alouettes find themselves will be so promptly righted," he said.

Weeping tears bigger than light bulbs, Vern (Montreal-Gazette) Deger just can't understand why Montreal has no Civic Stadium. "It simply doesn't add up," he says, that Canada's leading city has to rely on the patronage of a professional baseball organization before booking a football game.

Tossing a bouquet to Toronto Deger looks enviously at the big sports field at the Canadian National Exhibition grounds—a Civic Project. "Its construction has been fraught with difficulties and conditions for presentation of football are far from good. "But Toronto is on the right track," he said.

Former principal of St. Stephen's College in Edmonton, he was moderator of the United Church from 1940 to 1942. He retired in 1943.
