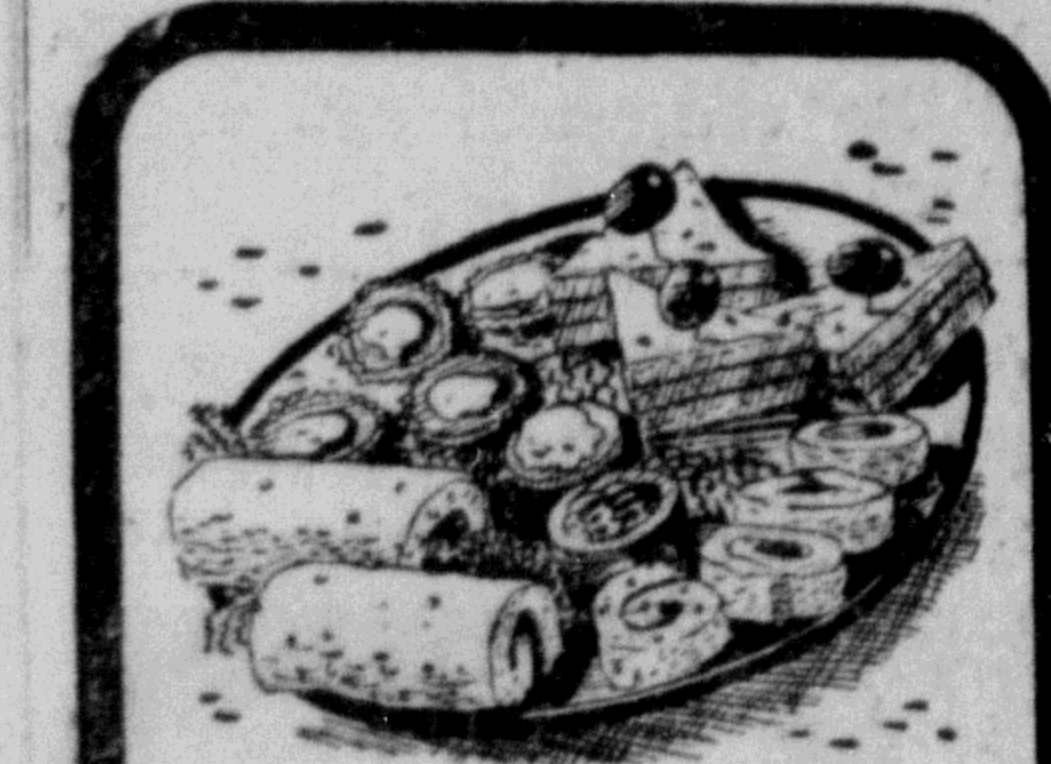

**Talks Of  
Murderers**

A man who was in spiritual attendance to police-killer Harry Medos when he paid the death penalty for murder last year told Prince Rupert Rotarians Thursday that the moral climate of a community is dependent on the religious instruction given to its young people.

He was Rev. W. H. Ross MacPherson, evangelist and for three years chaplain at Oakalla prison where this province's condemned murderers are hanged.

Addressing the weekly luncheon meeting of the Rotary Club, Mr. MacPherson declared that statements made by such convicted killers as Medos, Bill Henderson, Jacob Weed, Gordon Burk and Ed Johnson in Vancouver had convinced him of that fact.

"I contend from my experience that, if we promote Bible Sunday School enterprises, it will not be long before we empty our courts and jails and fill our churches," he declared. "I feel it is the only way we can develop citizens we can be proud of."

Portrayal of these killers as "brutes, at enmity with society" was not entirely accurate, according to his experiences, Mr. MacPherson declared.

"Largely speaking, they were products of our society, a society that is at enmity with God," he countered.

A 17-page statement, written for Mr. MacPherson by Harry Medos five days before his execution for the killing of a policeman on the False Creek flats following a hold-up attempt, was displayed by the speaker, who read excerpts from it.

"At the age of 17, Medos left the Los Angeles with \$12,000 which he had gained from crime, Mr.

MacPherson said. "Like many other youths, he was looking for excitement and easy money."

Wife-killer Jacob Weed and Ed Johnson, convicted of killing a woman in Stanley Park, said that they both had been under the influence of liquor at the time. Weed could remember nothing of the circumstances of his wife's death.

A. Bruce Brown, who acted as club chairman in the absence of President R. G. Van der Sluys, thanked Mr. MacPherson for his address. Mr. MacPherson is currently conducting a series of evangelistic meetings at the Regular Baptist Church here. He was guest of G. R. S. Blackaby.

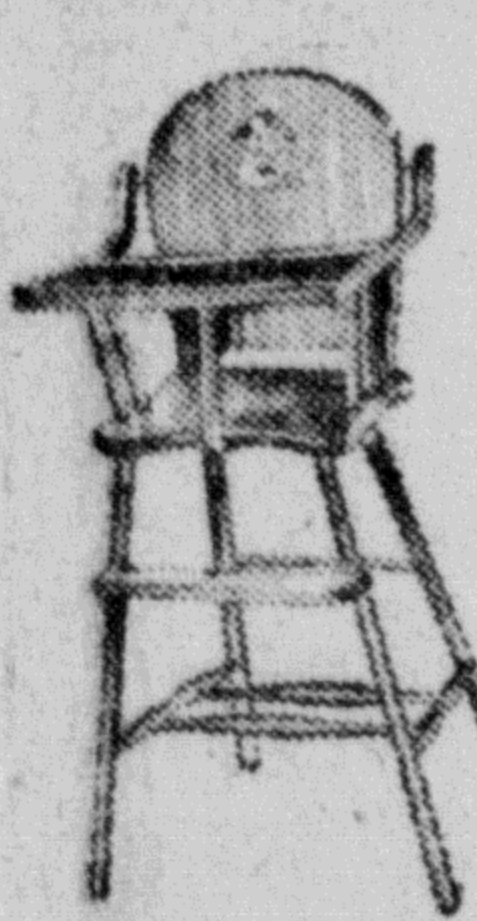
