TIGHTENING UP ON BALL RULES

When the executive of the City Baseball league met last night, a motion to refer a Merchant protest of the Sunday Commercial-Merchant game to a protest board was defeated on a technicality. An alternative

plan whereby the Commercial forfeit their right to a bye in the play-off was approved and, in the draw for play-off positions, the Savoy team gained the right to meet the winner between Commercial and Merchants. The latter two teams begin the best-out-of-three series tonight.

Evening games will be seven innings while Sunday afternoon's contest will go the regular nine innings. Final round of the play-off will also be decided on the two wins basis.

Justification or legality of Merchants' protest was not discussed but laxness in enforcing the rules of the constitution was admitted and President Art Murray gave assurance that future infractions would not be tolerated. This will mean that players involved in the dispute will not be allowed to play in further games this year. No player may be signed by a team after the middle of the schedule without executive approval.
