The Fustys Stick To "The Club Bid" And Find Themselves Clouted

Mr. and Mrs. Fusty still stick to "the Club Bid." This vague and mysterious device can, I feel, mean almost anything. Many of its users can't explain it too clearly.

Many explanations are sharply at variance with others. Most of the country's top players don't use any kind of an artificial one-club opening.

Probably the best known of the artificial club openings is the Vanderbilt Club which is what the Fustys profess to use. In this "system," when you open with one club you are saying you have a full honor trick better than a minimum opening bid.

FROM 3 PLUS UP Of course, you might have more. You could have anywhere from three plus honor tricks to all of the high cards. (Partner must respond to the one club bid.)

In today's deal, Mr. Fusty opened one of these bids. If his wife had bid anything but one diamond, he would have known she had the ace and king of clubs. In other words, a one diamond response says you have less than an ace and a king.

Even if Mrs. Fusty responded with one diamond, Mr. Fusty planned to jump to two spades on the second round and that would have committed his side to a game contract.

ENTER THE VILLAIN Before that point was reached, however, a villain stepped into the picture in the form of Mr. Dale. His opponents had told each other nothing except, vaguely, how many aces and kings they had or didn't have.

Mr. Dale decided to let them look for their spot at the four range. After his four club bid, Mr. Fusty had to guess what to do. He knew he could set Mr. Dale.
