

Lenten Season Exhortation

In a second of a series of Lenten sermons, Bishop Jordan exhorted the congregation of Annunciation Church Sunday to read and become familiar with the New Testament during Lent.

The Bishop explained that Christ himself was confronted with perplexing everyday problems and solved them in ways which could be easily imitated by people today. For instance, when asked for a judgment on the sinful woman, Christ invited anyone who had not sinned to throw the first stone and the crowd immediately dispersed.

"Greater knowledge of the life of Christ leads to a wholesome enthusiasm for religion," said the Bishop.

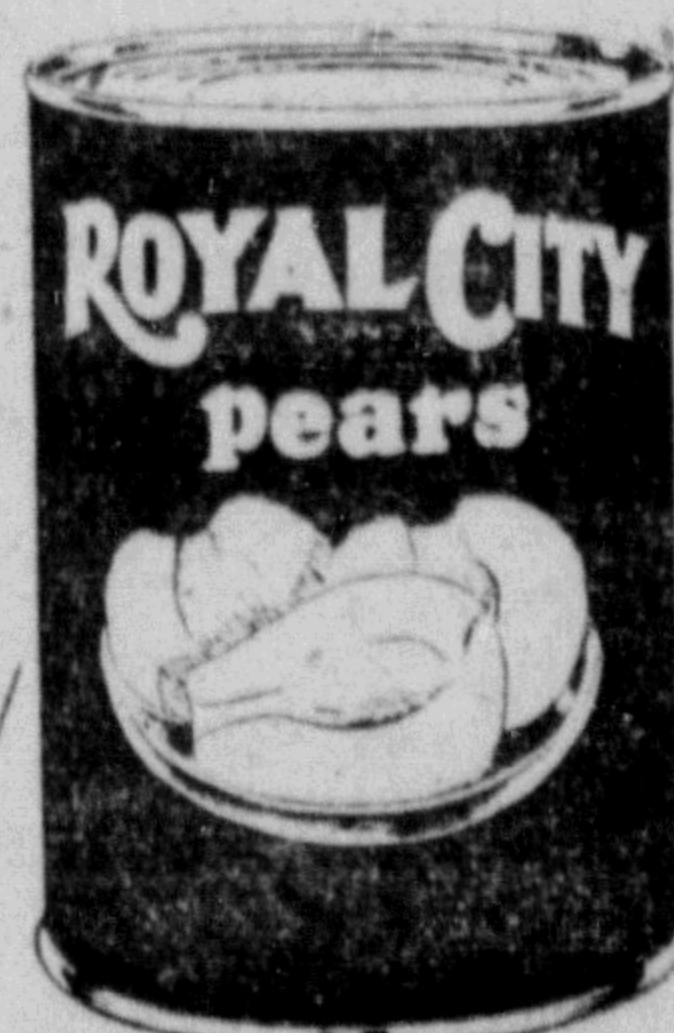

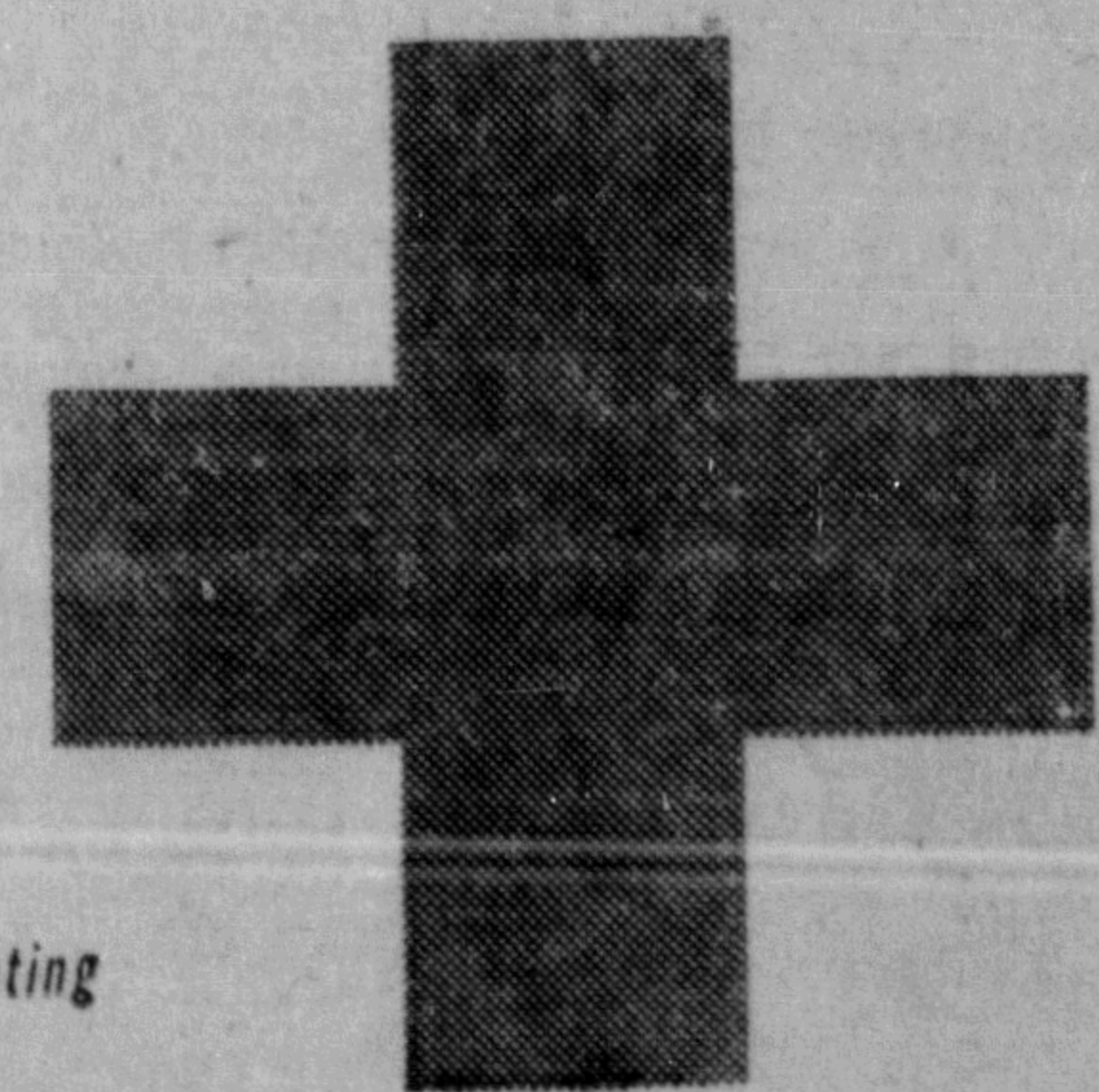
