Shrine Hospitals were mentioned in nationwide publicity starting from a simple human-interest story emanating from Covington, Tennessee—a story of a crippled girl who was helped to regain her health.

How The Shrine Found Its Soul

This picture of the wandering Minstrel is that of Noble Eugene Reitz, of Isis Temple, who played on his horn the popular song "I'm Forever Blowing Bubbles" at the entrance to the Multnomah Hotel in Portland, Oregon, at four o'clock on the June morning of 1920. This incident was used with great effect by Noble Adair in his stirring appeal for passage of the Resolution.

Noble Reitz was laid at rest on September 30, 1944, and to his memory we pay tribute. The part he played in the establishment of Shriners' Hospitals for Crippled Children was an unwitting but most important one; thus demonstrating that "God moves in a mysterious way. His wonders to perform."

In his speech, Noble Adair dramatically appealed to the assembled representatives to pass the resolution and provide the Shrine with a reason for its existence, instead of "Forever Blowing Bubbles."

On that day, back in 1920, the clouds outside had been hanging low and rain had been falling throughout the afternoon. When the resolution was passed by unanimous vote, the sun suddenly broke through the clouds and shone down through the windows upon the Representatives there assembled and filled the house with glory... The Shrine Had Found Its Soul!

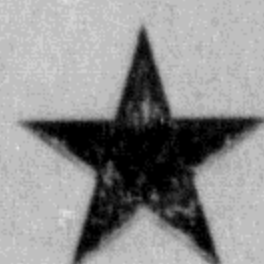
