Education For All

(Since national attention will be focussed next week on the achievements and problems of education, The Daily News today carries the following guest editorial by the Prince Rupert Trades and Labor Council on this subject which is of such importance to all.)

ANADIANS today have far greater opporunities to become well-educated, happy and useful citizens than ever before, but we have a ong way yet to go.

The progress that has been made in educational tandards, facilities, methods, etc., is due not enirely to the efforts of those directly entrusted with he supervision and administration of education, but ilso it reflects the increasingly active interest and support of Canadians in all walks of life, and the shortcomings that still exist in our present educational system can only be overcome through the continuance and extension of that interest and support.

That is why Labor has joined with other or- relatives. ganizations across Canada in sponsoring Education Week and to urge special consideration of the matter which is vital to your family, your community and your country.

The principal shortcoming in our present educational system, against which Labor has consistently objected and for the elimination of which it will continue to strive, is that in spite of the fact that considerable sums of public money are being expended on our universities, the sons and daughters from the less fortunate families are being deprived of the opportunities for advanced education offered through those institutions because their parents are unable to afford the expenses involved. We submit that society would be greatly enriched if ability and talent of the student, coupled with his or her willingness to work at it, were the only qualifying factors for admission.

The interest, ideas and active participation of all those in the labor movement in Canada are vital to the improvement of education in this country.

All organizations affiliated to the Trades and Labor Congress of Canada are urged to support Education Week in their various communities and to bear in mind that education is truly "Everybody's Business".

Exaggerated Report

DEPORTS from Vancouver that drug addicts are invading Prince Rupert are baloney.

There are addicts in the city, undoubtedly. Any city with an element of transients is certain to have the problem to some extent. But the suggestion that we are harboring a community of hop heads is complete bilge.

This is not a question of being smug. Consider it factually. The give-away of a drug addict is his need for money. To keep the supply coming, he must be able to pay well, and normally the person so addicted is not in a position to earn the cash required. His course, then, is to get the money by other means.

If Prince Rupert were experiencing an extraordinary outbreak of crime there might be something to support the Vancouver reports. But there is no such thing.

Vancouver police might as well realize—as they undoubtedly do-that they cannot get rid of the problem that easily. Even an addict in the deepest throes of his craving will know he has a better chance of buying his shot in the big city where detection is not nearly so sure as it is publicised and where crime is more or less routine.




