**Hero-Worship Gives Inferiority Complex**  
 It's an encouraging note for less experienced  
 players that many of the fine plays which the ex-  
 perts tell about are basically simple in nature. Don't  
 let hero-worship drug you into believing that you  
 can't make these same fine plays yourself. Actual-  
 ly, you're better than you think. At least you can be  
 —if you'll work at it a little.

Take end-plays, for example.  
 Some hands involving end-plays  
 really "play themselves." Look  
 at today's hand. Mr. New, the  
 avid kibitzer, got into a four-  
 heart contract and the opening  
 leading was the nine of spades.  
 Mrs. Keen won with the queen  
 and ace and put dummy in with  
 a third lead of the suit.

**FAIR CHANCE**  
 Now Mr. New was completely  
 unconscious of the fact that he  
 had a pretty fair chance for his  
 contract. He was sure he would  
 have to lose two diamond tricks  
 for down one.

He took three rounds of  
 trumps. Next he cashed the ace  
 and king of clubs—only be-  
 cause he wanted to put off un-  
 til last the sad sad moment  
 when he would have to break  
 diamonds.

But when he led the ace of  
 diamonds and followed with the  
 deuce, something happened. The  
 eight was played from dummy.  
 Mrs. Keen won with the queen  
 and at this point the defence  
 was through.

Mrs. Keen had only black  
 cards left. She returned a club  
 and Mr. New, still wondering  
 why somebody hadn't cashed the  
 king of diamonds, had sense  
 enough to discard the trey of

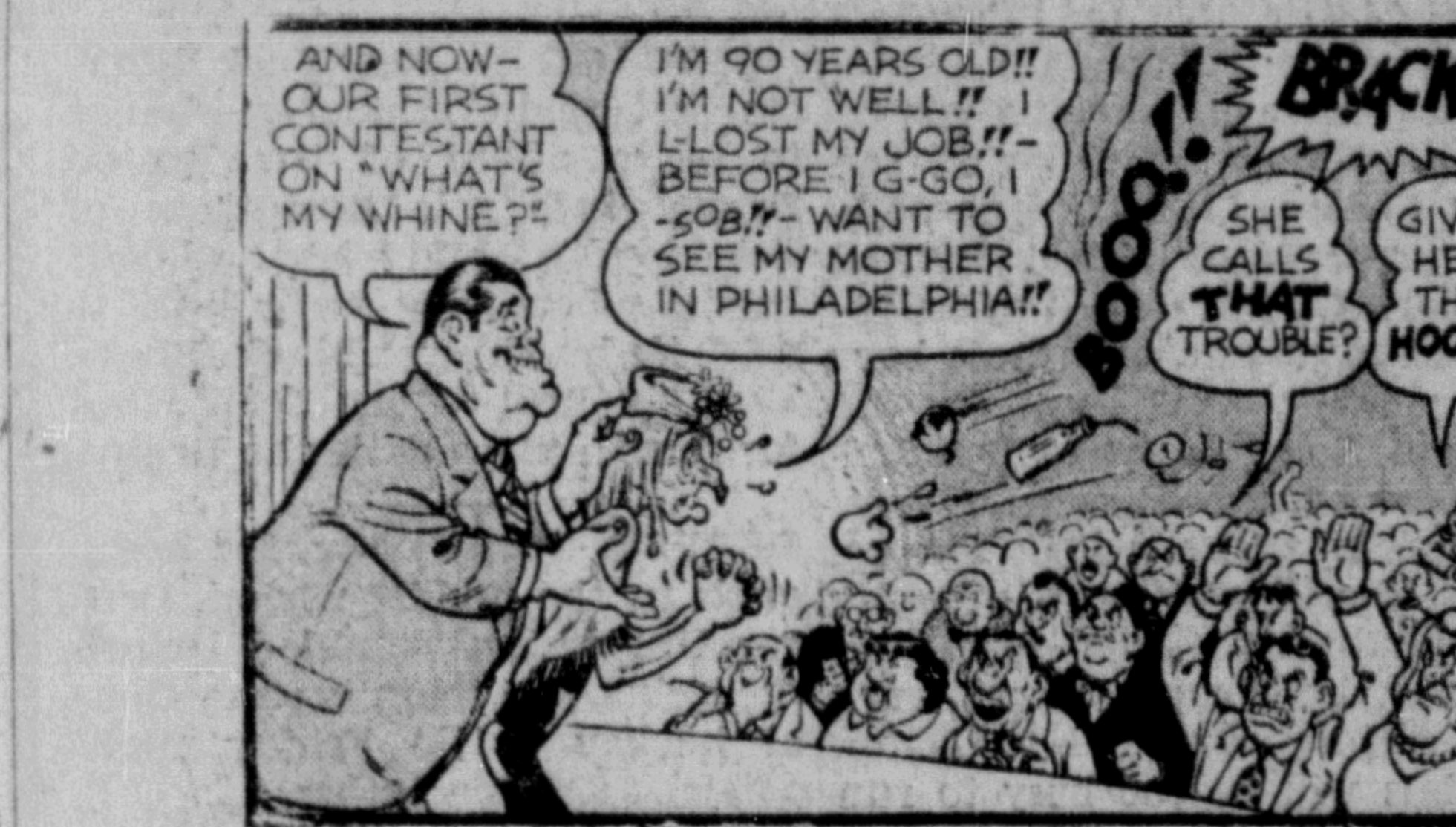
diamonds and ruff in dummy.  
 Obviously it wouldn't have help-  
 ed for Miss Brash to play the  
 king on the second diamond  
 lead as that would have drop-  
 ped her partner's queen and  
 made dummy's jack good.

Of course I recommend that  
 you consciously do the things  
 Mr. New did on this hand. Note  
 that he picked up the opposing  
 trumps, leaving at least one in  
 his own hand and dummy. Note  
 also that he stripped his own  
 hand and dummy of all other  
 side suits before throwing Mrs.  
 Keen in with a diamond. That  
 made sure that she would have  
 no safe return.
