3BLACKWOOD on BRIDGE

Tricky Plays Not Necessarily Best

"Well, at least your defense is consistent, Muzzy," said Mr. Champion after the play of today's hand. "You are consistently of more help to declarer than you are to your partner."

"What more could I do?" Mr. Muzzy asked. "I did everything I could to fool him."

"That's just the point," replied Mr. Champion. "If you'd concentrate on making good plays instead of tricky plays, you'd do a lot better."

PLAYS THE DEUCE
Mr. Champion was grousing because Mr. Abel made his very speculative three no trump contract on the following play.

Mr. Champion elected to open the ten of hearts and Mr. Abel won with the queen. Mr. Muzzy played the deuce. A small diamond was led toward the board and the queen won. A diamond was returned to the king and Mr. Champion won with the ace.

He made his best return, the four of spades. The jack went on from dummy and Mr. Muzzy decided to false-card by winning with the king, thus denying possession of the queen. This deception was successful in that Mr. Abel now placed the queen of spades on his left. However, Mr. Champion placed that card in Mr. Abel's hand and considered further spade leads from his hand as hopeless.

CLUB STOPPER
At trick five Mr. Muzzy led a low heart and the jack in the closed hand won. Mr. Abel now led the deuce of clubs. Here Mr. Champion could have beaten the hand by going in with the ace and returning a spade, setting up the queen while Mr. Muzzy still had a club stopper. But being completely in the dark, he played low, the queen went on from dummy and Mr. Muzzy won with the king.

Mr. Abel won the heart return and fired another club. Mr. Champion won but now Mr. Abel had nine tricks.

On the defense it occasionally pays to make a deceptive play. As a general rule, however, it is more important to help your partner than to deceive the declarer. Remember, declarer can see his partner's hand but your partner cannot see yours.
