Winch Queries Timber Source

VANCOUVER—A Vancouver newspaper in a front page story Monday said it had obtained confirmation that United States timber was used in B.C. Government contracts for ferry landings and public work at Swartz Bay and Fulford Bay. The timber controversy was thrown into the federal election campaign last week by Harold Winch, CCF candidate in Vancouver East. Mr. Winch attacked the government for not stipulating that B.C. timber be used in the ferry contracts. Later, government officials denied Mr. Winch's charges and said B.C. timber was used but that cross-treating to preserve the timber had been done in the U.S. The paper said it had obtained confirmation that U.S. timber was used in the projects but added: "No officials were talking about it—officially."
