was the Able Lady, on which Johnny Kapustianyk landed 4,132 pounds.

New methods, or new boats are not easily accepted in the fishing industry by those in production. Tried and tested ways are hard to beat, so many fishermen laughed when they witnessed the wide-beamed, awkward looking east coast crabber about to be initiated into the halibut industry here.

But Bob MacDonald, skipper of the Charlotte S., let them laugh, convinced that he was doing the right thing. A year ago, he shipped the hull of the Nova Scotia-built boat to Prince Rupert and fitted her with cabin and engine.

MacDonald and his two mates, Roy Payne and Bill King were taking it comparatively easy on the Heate flats in a 25-mile-an-hour sea which had discouraged even the large schooners. In eight days, the three men landed 23,000 pounds of fish.

One of the biggest jobs in the small-boat halibut operation is done by the packers, life line for the camps and of the business as a whole.

The Clausens operate two packers, the Rapp, skippered by the father, and the Hillside I, by Elmer. The Hillside supplies the southern camps such as Squadaree and another at Butler's Cove at the south end of Stephens Island.

Besides keeping the camps well-stocked with fresh provisions and other fishermen's needs, bringing mail to the boats and camp tenders, main job is to take the fish from the camps to market in Prince Rupert.

Capacity load of some 85,000 pounds of fresh halibut are taken aboard the Hillside at times. The crew of four men and the skipper, work hard, sleep little, are often on the go 24 hours a day.

Members of the Hillside crew are Bud Chambers, first mate; Wally Squires, second mate; Art Williams, cook and Nord Mueller, engineer. While each has an assigned position all pitch in wherever needed to expedite loading and fast transport of cargo to port.

The halibut fishing industry is a big business and it's a fast game, leaving little time for anything but hard work and the lagardis fall by the wayside.

There have been times when halibut fishermen on large and small boats have made a lot of money in a short time, but considering the risks involved, both to investment and life, and the work required to reap the harvest from the sea in a race against time and quotas, every penny made is well earned.

Violated Rule Leads Mr. Champion Astray

"Aces are for killing kings" goes an old bridge adage. Mr. Dale violated this "rule" when he made a deceptive play to defeat the slam in today's deal.

The bidding had sounded very strong and confident and Mr. Dale, holding an ace, a queen and a jack, felt that his partner had practically nothing and certainly could not be counted on to take a trick in any side suit. The only hope seemed to be that Mr. Muzzy might have the jack of trumps.

Since Mr. Champion had bid his spades secondarily, it appeared likely that he had only four spades. If so, Mr. Muzzy's jack (if he had that card) was twice guarded.

These thoughts flitted through Mr. Dale's head after he saw Mr. Champion win his queen of diamonds opening with the king. At trick two, Mr. Champion led a small heart to dummy's jack and returned the 10 of spades. For a wonder, Mr. Muzzy did not cover, but promptly followed suit with the four. Even the great Mr. Champion cannot see through the backs of the cards, and with considerable reason he now figured the ace of spades to be on his right. He went to the board again with the ace of clubs and led back the nine of spades.
