Dollar Problem Up to U.S.

OWEN SOUND (C)—Prime Minister St. Laurent said Thursday night that solving the dollar-sterling problem is more a job for the United States than for Canada.

In a federal election campaign speech on the eve of closing his Ontario tour, he said solution of the problem can come through the U.S. buying more goods from other countries and enabling those countries to import more.

"The U.S. is such a huge market compared with Canada that we Canadians cannot solve this dollar shortage problem of the sterling area and the European nations by ourselves. And don't let anyone fool us with empty promises that we can."

George Drew, national leader of the Progressive Conservative party, had contended a change in government would "regain" the British market for Canada. Yet during the last four years of Parliament, the Conservatives had produced no "magic formula" to increase trade with Britain, he said.

"If they have some method of putting our overseas customers in funds which they have been keeping secret since 1949, then it is the Conservatives and not the government you should blame for failing to solve this problem."

Humanics Can Be Used To Make Good Decision

Even though you recognize the need to keep a "dangerous" opponent out of the lead, it is not always clear how this desirable result can be accomplished. Today's hand illustrates how humanics can be used to reach a correct final decision.

Mr. Champion won the first trick with the king of hearts. Mr. Muzzy played the deuce on the trick, definitely requesting a shift. What could he want? Not a club apparently, since there were two club honors in dummy and Mr. Champion had the jack. If Mr. Muzzy had the king he would almost certainly win a trick with it later.

So Mr. Champion made a good shift to the queen of diamonds. Mr. Dale won the trick. With this shift he had to lose a diamond trick. He had already lost a heart. And on the bidding he expected to lose a trick to the king of spades. Obviously, he could not afford to let Mr. Champion ruff a diamond lead. What was that queen of diamonds? With the jack showing in dummy, it was not the top of an honor sequence. Surely it was either a singleton or the top of a doubleton.

If it were a doubleton, Mr. Dale had to duck in dummy and win the second diamond lead so Mr. Champion would have no more of the suit to lead when he was in with his supposed king of spades.

If it were a singleton, however, the right play to cut the communication between the defenders' hands was to win with the ace at once.

Which play would you make? Mr. Dale decided his best chance was to duck the first diamond lead. He felt it was about 50-50 as to whether the queen were singleton or doubleton. But here was the clincher. His right hand opponent was Mr. Muzzy. Even if the lead were a singleton the odds were overwhelming that it would never occur to Mr. Muzzy to overtake with the king and return a diamond for Mr. Cham-
