**BLACKWOOD on
 BRIDGE**

Sometimes End-Play Offers Only Chance
 Sometimes you have the choice of a finesse or an
 end-play to make your contract. There are occa-
 sions, however, where the finesse cannot win and the
 end-play at least has a chance.

In today's deal the opening
 lead was the king of diamonds.
 In spite of his tremendous hand,
 Mr. Dale was embarrassed by a
 lack of entries to the board.
 Dummy could furnish a fourth
 spade trick and a fourth heart
 trick but there was no sure way
 to reach them. The queen of
 clubs was the only hope.

Mr. Dale ducked the first two
 diamond leads and won the
 third with the ace. Mrs. Keen
 discarding two hearts. He cashed
 his three top honors in both
 hearts and spades.

Now the lead of a low club
 toward the queen would never
 win the hand. That is, if Mr.
 Abel had the king, he would win
 the first club lead and cash two
 more diamonds. If Mrs. Keen
 had the king she would kick
 dummy's queen with it and the
 last possible entry to the board
 would be gone.

Here was a case where the
 end-play was the only hope and
 a pretty good hope at that. It
 depended on Mr. Abel's holding
 the king of clubs — a 39-50
 chance.

PUS ABEL IN
 Mr. Abel had shown out of
 spades and hearts, discarding a
 club on the third lead of each
 of those suits. He was known to
 have left exactly two diamonds.
 So at the tenth trick Mr.

Dale led his last diamond and
 Mr. Abel was in. He cashed two
 diamond tricks and then led the
 eight of clubs. Mr. Dale put up
 dummy's queen and when it
 won, he had the rest of the
 tricks.

Of course if Mrs. Keen had
 held the king of clubs, the at-
 tempted end-play would have
 been unsuccessful. But in that
 case there would have been no
 play for the contract.

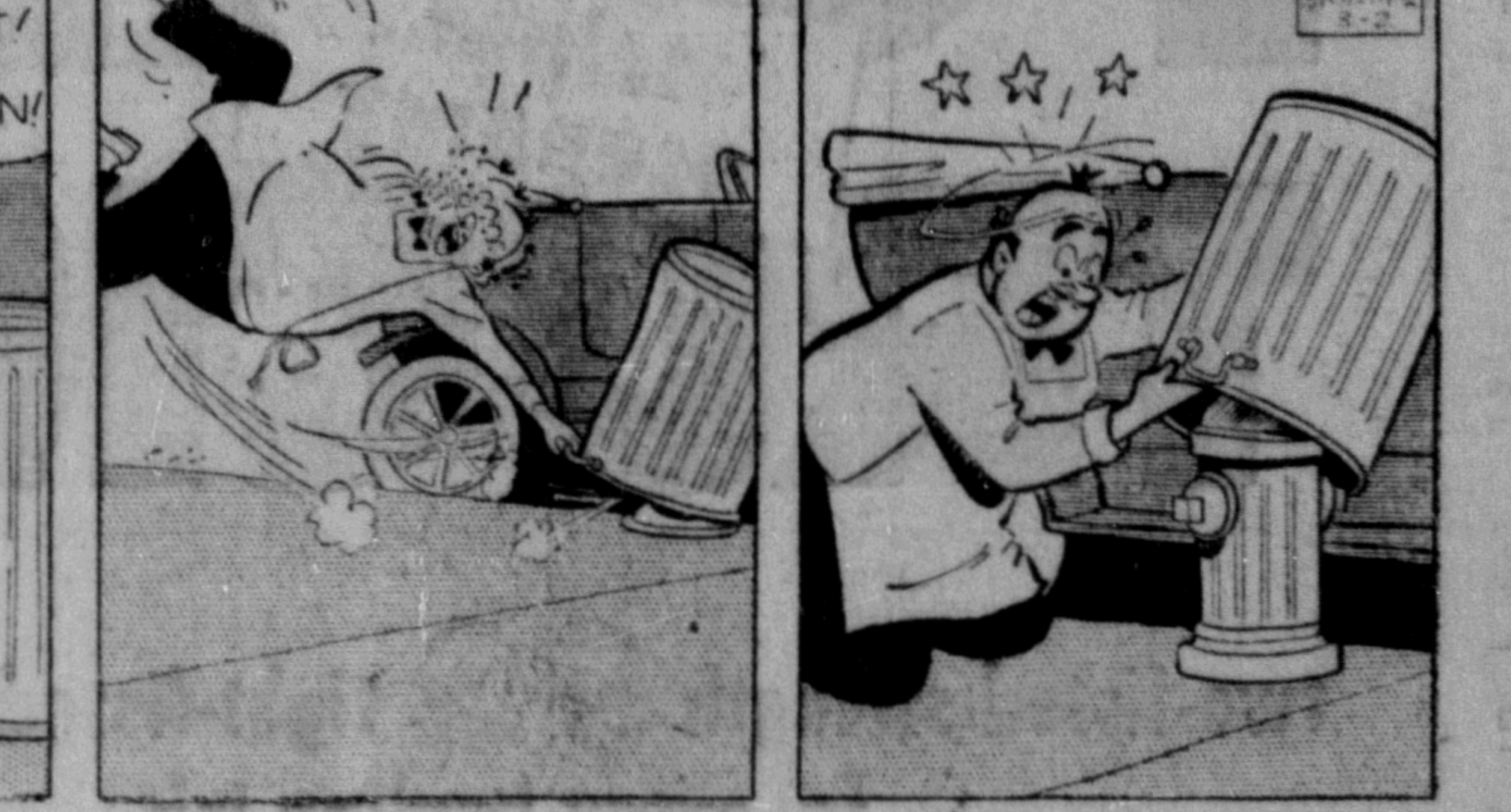
