Alcoa Scores Government Suit

NEW YORK (AP)-The Aluminum Co. of America has charged that the United States government's suit to prevent the company from buying 600,000 tons of Canadian aluminum would deprive thousands of independent American fabricators of aluminmum needed to keep their plants

The accusation was made in an answer filed in federal court to a suit brought by the government last month. The action seeks cancellation of a contract by which Alcoa would buy the aluminum from Aluminum, Ltd., of Canada over a six-year perwiod. The U.S. government also asked the court to terminate a judgment entered in 1951 directing certain large stockholders of Alcoa to dispose of their holdsings in the Canadian company during a 10-year period.
