JASPER, Alta.—Marilyn Mon-
roe's "Million Dollar CNR Spec-
ial" train which has been op-
erating over the Canadian Na-
tional Railways main line be-
tween Jasper Village and the
movie location at Devona, Al-
berta for ten days made its last
run Wednesday with the glamor-
ous movie star riding in the
caboose along with Conductor
Bob Swanson.

In the two coaches were 70
members of the 20th Century

ert Mitchum and Rory Calhoun.
